ORCSD SCHOOL BOARD FACILITY COMMITTEE CHARGE (Adopted by School Board 7/19/2017)

Envisioning a three-year time frame, the Board charges the committee to further analyze the condition of the current middle school, to explore all possible on-site renovations or new construction, or relocation and new construction, and to explore grade level reconfiguration. The committee will arrive at what we believe to be the best option to proceed to design/plan by June 2018.

In order to broaden participation in the process, the School Board has authorized Superintendent Morse to create a Superintentent's Facility Committee whose membership will include: 3 Board members, a Councilor from Durham and a Selectman from Lee and Madbury, Dr. Morse, the Business Administrator, the MS Principal and **6 additional community members** from Durham, Lee and Madbury. They envision one evening meeting a month starting in September. TOWN FOREST WALK Saturday, August 5th 9:00 am – noon

August is a wonderful time for a long walk in the Lee Town Forest. There are still birds singing and many are well into raising their second broods. The buzz saw drone of cicadas marks the onset of the late-summer/early-autumn insect chorus. Plant life is lush at this time of year, with many trees and herbs setting seeds, while others are just coming into bloom. One of the loveliest of the forest floor plants encountered in the forest is downy rattlesnake plantain (pictured above). This petite and hardy member of the orchid family is beloved for its rosette of evergreen leaves with their striking network of white veins - giving them the look of snakeskin.

We'll be on the lookout for this and other flora of the forest during our walk tomorrow, which is part of the series of "Easement Excursions" sponsored by the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests (SPNHF). Led by Lauren Kras (easement steward, SPNHF), and Catherine Fisher (Lee Conservation Commission), we'll explore some of the diverse habitats encompassed by this 191 acre property and learn about ongoing stewardship activities. This is a long walk so we will stop often. Bring plenty of water, snacks/lunch and insect repellant. Sturdy and comfortable hiking shoes are a plus. Open to all ages. We'll meet at the Safety Complex parking lot at 9:00 am.
