LEE CONSERVATION COMMISSION UPDATE ON THE MAUD JONES FOREST PROJECT

A new walking trail in the Maud Jones Memorial Forest began on Saturday, August 2^{nd} . The trail conforms to the management plan that is in place for this certified tree farm. The path was initially located and cleared by UNH studens earlier this year under the direction of Professor Donald Quigley. The work to be done includes signs, trail markings and path improvements. It has been proposed by Eagle Scout candidate, Will Stone of Troop 154, and approved by the Lee Conservation Commission and the Board of Selectmen. Will has responsibility for planning and directing the progress of the project, with the work to be done by members of the troop and their leaders. The trail will consist of an 0.8 mile loop that begins and ends at the Tree Farm sign and parking area along the west side of Garrity Road. Another work session is planned for August 10th with follow-up work to be scheduled in needed. Following the completion of the project, a public walk and celebration will be announced. MONDAY, AUGUST 18TH at dawn: Jupiter and Venus will be visible near the horizon; see stars Aldebaran and the Haydes Cluster in Taurus as well as Venus and the Beehive Cluster in the low eastern horizon.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 20TH at dawn: The Beehive Cluster and Jupiter will be visible in the low eastern horizon.

BITS of HISTORY from The NEWMARKET ADVERTISER August 5, 1893
