

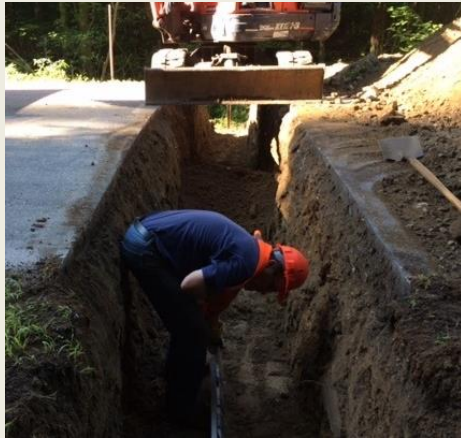

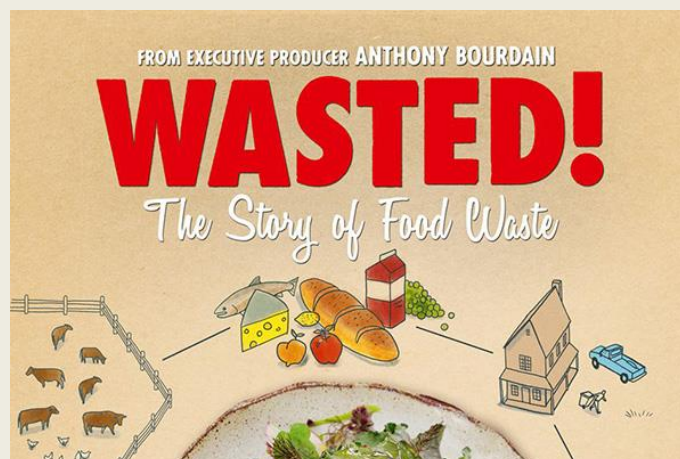

WHEN SECONDS COUNT...

Can the Police, Fire, or Ambulance find your home when you need them for assistance with an emergency? Can they find it at night? Can they find it during a snowstorm?

Having your name and number on a mailbox is just not enough. Some mailboxes are clustered together. The numbers are small and the location may not mark the entrance to your driveway.

The Lee Firemen's Association, in a joint effort with the Lee Fire Department, has started a program to install reflective house number signs at driveway entrances to assist all emergency responders in locating your home in a time of need.

The cost for each sign with a post is \$30.00 and it will be installed by the Lee Firemen's Association.

A LEE FIRE & PLANNING AND ZONING DEPARTMENT REMINDER TO ALL HOMEOWNERS AND BUSINESSES IN THE TOWN OF LEE

A Building Permit is required for all tents that are 400 square feet and over per the International Building Code adopted by NH and the Town of Lee. An Assembly Permit is required for all tents being occupied by more than 50 people per RSA 155:17-39. ATTENTION REGARDING YARD SALES

Yard Sales bring up an issue of signs being posted improperly. Please remember that advertisements of any kind need to be posted on "free standing" posts, not on telephone poles, street signs, markers, posts, etc. If you do put signs out for yards sales etc., please make sure that they do not block the view of traffic, are not on town property, and, if on private property that you have the land owner's permission and that you remove them once the event is over. Signs that are left behind generally end up blowing away and become trash. Thank you!

CHAPTER 236
HIGHWAY REGULATION, PROTECTION AND CONTROL REGULATIONS
Outdoor Advertising - Section 236:75

236:75 No Advertisements of Any Kind Upon Certain Objects. –Notwithstanding any provisions of the law to the contrary, it shall be unlawful to affix, attach or display any advertisement upon any object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, directly in such a manner that the object of nature, utility pole, telephone booth, or highway sign, is utilized as an integral part of the sign's support as distinguished from being only incidentally a support to the sign, such as the earth or ground upon which a sign is affixed. This prohibition shall extend to all primary and secondary highways and roads of and within the state without exception for any type of advertising. The owner of an object upon which an advertisement is placed in violation of this section shall be entitled to remove and destroy the advertisement and the advertisement owner shall not be entitled to damages or compensation therefor. The object owner shall be entitled to collect the costs associated with the removal and destruction from the advertisement owner or the person who is responsible for placing the advertisement on the object in violation of this section.

Residents are invited to join members of the Conservation Commission any Wednesday morning while they conduct site walks on the Town's conserved properties. Some of these lands are owned by the Town, but most of them are privately owned and protected in perpetuity with a conservation easement. Standard precautions for ticks & mosquitoes are advised. Walks take 1½-2 hrs.

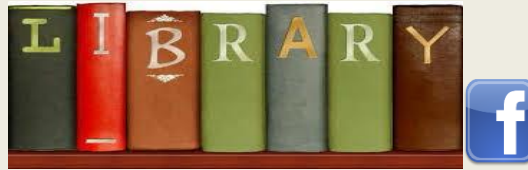
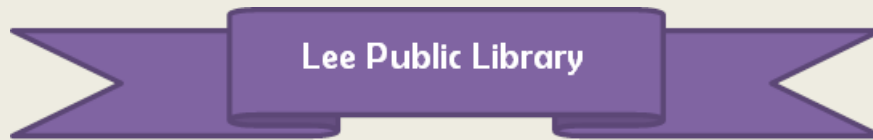
A drop-off is available at the Public Safety Complex to the left of the front entrance for unused and unwanted prescriptions.



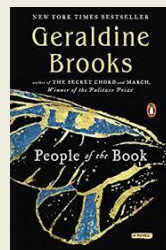
NEWS FROM THE LEE HERITAGE COMMISSION!

- The Lee Town Center is now sporting a bright new summer look, due to the Lee Heritage Commission asking our very own Lee artist, Amy Daskal, co-owner of Blue Bell Greenhouse, to design some colorful banners. The two Little River Park banners should be up this week!
- We are hoping to hear soon that the Lee Historical Society building has been placed on the NH State Historical Register. The Lee Town Hall building and the Lee Town Shed (with Tramp Room) building were both placed on the NH State Historical Register earlier this year. A hearty "Huzzah!" for Laurel Cox, who did painstaking research on the history of these buildings!
- Additionally, Lee Heritage Commission member Denis Hambucken is currently designing signs that will be put up on all of the Lee Town buildings that have been placed on state register. The signs will give the name and date of each building, as well as stating that it has been listed on the New Hampshire State Historic Register.
- The Lee Heritage Commission is already making plans for our booth at this year's Lee Fair on September 8th. The LHC will have a great selection of Lee history publications available for sale at the fair, as well as the remaining Lee 250th Celebration items: mugs, kids t-shirts, coins, wooden nickels, and bells.
