THIS WEEK'S LEE TRIVIA QUESTION (*answer will be given in next week's Lee* E-Crier): What section of Lee was settled by human occupants more than 8,000 years ago?

THE ANSWER TO LAST WEEK'S TRIVIA QUESTION: In 1837, the Town of Lee purchased property to serve as its "poor farm". On what road in Lee was the poor farm located?

Answer: The Lee Town poor farm was on Wednesday Hill Road, and might have been in operation as early as 1835 (rather than 1837 as mentioned in the trivia question). It was located where the Velvet Pastures Elk Ranch, owned by Jim and Lou Ann Griswold, is today. "For more than 40 years (1835 – 1878), the property served as the Town Farm, caring for the indigent and homeless of Lee until they could get back on their own. The farm reverted to private ownership in 1878 and was farmed primarily as a dairy operation until the establishment of the elk farm in 1999". The town poor farm ceased operating about the time that the State of New Hampshire adopted the County Poor Farm system to care for the poor, rather than placing that responsibility on the individual towns (although the towns were still expected to assist with the financial support of the county farms).
