COASTAL CLEANUP, OYSTER RIVER STYLE

Saturday, September 19th 9:00 am, Old Landing in Durham

Coastal Cleanup in the Seacoast Area is sponsored by the Blue Ocean Society. Here's a chance to do something green and useful close to home. The Oyster River Watershed Association will be coordinating cleanup at several locations along the Oyster River and tributary streams in Durham. Volunteers will be supplied with gloves, bags and tally sheets so they can pick up trash in assigned stretches of shoreline, separating out recyclables and tallying in categories. When the trash is brought to the meeting place, the materials will be weighed and the counts will be totaled for reporting to the Blue Ocean Society. Pick up at most locations can be completed in an hour or so, depending on the numbers of volunteers. This is a fun way for families and other groups to contribute to community and coastal well-being and health. Old Landing Road, which leads to the Old Landing parking area, is the second road on the right toward Dover beyond the Main Street - Route 108 traffic light. The SAC is helping the Heritage Commission with promoting the 250th celebration and they need your help! Four of their most generous volunteers have moved from town. Can **YOU** help out?



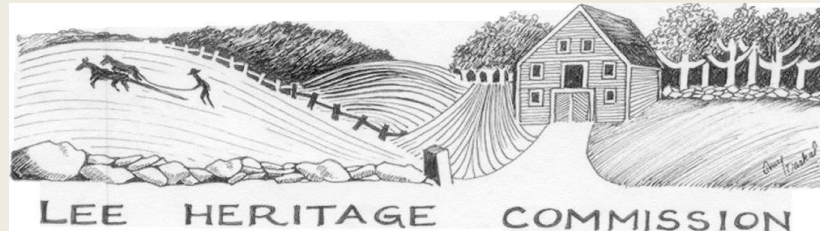

**CAP Served More than 20,000 Meals During Summer
Meals Program with Help from Local Sponsors**

This past summer, Community Action Partnership of Strafford County made sure children across Strafford County still had breakfast and lunch when school was out.

CAP provided free breakfast and lunch to children up to age 18 through its participation in the federal Summer Food Service Program. This year, CAP operated 16 sites in Dover, Rochester and Somersworth and served a total of 20,421 meals in just 43 days. The Summer Meals staff, led by Jamie Swan, the agency's Health and Nutrition Services Manager, was able to provide these nutritious meals thanks in part to the generous sponsorship of Bank of New Hampshire and Share Our Strength Seacoast.

"I think as a society we forget that kids who receive free or reduced lunch at school also need support over the summer months. Sponsorships like this one are a very important part of our dedication to New Hampshire families and our support of organizations like CAP who truly make a difference," says Vickie L. Routhier, Senior Vice President, Chief Retail Banking and Marketing Officer at Bank of New Hampshire.

Additionally, CAP used the kitchen facilities and cafeteria at Spaulding High School in Rochester as a primary base of operations for a second year thanks to a partnership with SAU #54.

"It is because of the commitment of local sponsors and partners that we are able to prepare and distribute thousands of meals to children every day when school is out," says CAP Executive Director Betsey Andrews Parker. "Without their support, we would be unable to provide access to healthy foods so we want to say thank you for your generosity."

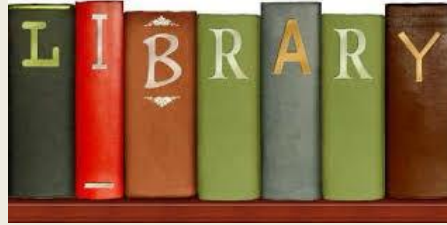


EVERY KID IN A PARK INITIATIVE

ROCKIN' READERS BOOK CLUB

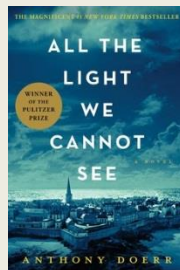
