CAPITAL CRIME OF WITCHCRAFT: WHAT THE PRIMARY SOURCES TELL US

Wednesday, October 2, 2013 AT 7:00PM

Location: Lee Public Safety Complex

Using facsimiles of primary source manuscripts, Margo Burns will explore the Salem witchcraft trials of 1692 and 1693, when nineteen people were hanged and one crushed to death, demonstrating how methodically and logically the Salem Court worked. Burns will also examine a variety of other cases against women in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Connecticut. The presenter, Margo Burns is the 10th generation great-granddaughter of Rebecca Nurse, who was hanged in Salem in 1692 on the charge of witchcraft. She is the project manager and an associate editor of Records of the Salem Witch-Hunt, published in 2009 by Cambridge University Press.

BITS of HISTORY from the NEWMARKET ADVERTISER

September 13, 1901

*Frank Dinsmore, who has recently moved to this town from Dorchester, MA, has decided to open a grocery store on the turnpike, at the place formerly occupied by Maurice Lane. He has the store well filled with everything usually kept in a country store, where he will be in attendance to meet customers at all times. Mr. Dinsmore, to meet possible customers and show up his goods, gave an opening night at his store, Monday evening, Sept 4, and the crowd was enormous, some coming in automobile, some in carriages, and many on foot. It was estimated 150 partook of the refreshments served. We wish him all possible success.

*Charles Welch had the tine of a fork run through the muscle of his arm recently, while working on the road.

*Also, Frank Ferland was kicked in the back by a horse. Although some ways from home, he managed to crawl on his hands and knees till he reached his domicile, and has been laid up for repairs ever since.
