FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 7TH - 13TH !

Urges Residents to "Have Two Ways Out!"

The Lee Fire & Rescue Department will be hosting Station Tours and providing handouts during Fire Prevention Week to promote "Have Two Ways Out!" Residents can learn more about the importance of fire escape planning and practice, as well as the power of prevention.

If you woke up to a fire in your home, how much time do you think you would have to get to safety? According to the nonprofit National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), 1/3 of American households estimated that they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life threatening. Unfortunately, the time available is often less. Lee's Fire Dept is teaming up with NFPA during Fire Prevention Week, to urge residents to "Have Two Ways Out!" This year's theme focuses on the importance of fire escape planning and practice.

In 2010, U.S. fire departments responded to 369,500 home structure fires. These fires caused 13,350 civilian injuries, 2,640 civilian deaths, and \$6.9 billion in direct damage. "One house fire was reported every 85 seconds in 2010," says Scott Nemet, Captain of the Lee Fire & Rescue Dept. "Fire is unpredictable and moves faster than most people realize. Having a tried and true escape plan with two ways out is essential to ensuring your family's safety should fire break out in your home."

Lee Fire & Rescue Department recommends the following tips for planning your family's escape:

Make a map of your home. Mark a door and a window that can be used to get out of every room.

Choose a meeting place outside in front of your home. This is where everyone can meet once they've escaped. Draw a picture of your outside meeting place on your escape plan.

Write the emergency telephone number for the fire department on your escape plan.

Sound the smoke alarm and practice your escape plan with everyone living in your home.

Keep your escape plan on the refrigerator and have your family practice the plan twice a year or whenever anyone in your home celebrates a birthday.

<u>NEW VOTER ID LAW DISPUTE GOES TO NH</u> <u>SUPREME COURT</u>

The NH Supreme Court agreed Monday to assume jurisdiction on a dispute over new voter registration requirements. Last week, the Strafford Superior Court filed a preliminary injunction blocking the new Voter ID requirements, but the Attorney General's office is asking the Supreme Court to overturn the Strafford County ruling. House Speaker Bill O'Brien also filed a motion with the Supreme Court asking to intervene on behalf of the House of Representatives.

At issue is whether or not out of state students attending school in NH will be required to register their car and get a NH driver's license if they wish to vote in NH.

All interested parties must file a response with the Supreme Court no later than the close of business on Thursday, October 4th, as the Court has agreed to expedite the case, given that the election is fast approaching.

FUEL AND ELECTRICAL ASSISTANCE

Residents who are concerned about their upcoming heating bills are encouraged to apply for Fuel Assistance through Strafford County Community Action.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, (Fuel Assistance), provides income-eligible households with help in paying energy bills during the winter months. You may also apply for the Electrical Assistance Program (this gives you a monthly discount on your electric bill) and Weatherization (this program can help to make your home more energy efficient). You may be eligible even if your heat is included in your rent!

Strafford County Community Action and the Town of Lee have made arrangements for applications for the above programs to be accepted on **Thursday, October 18**th at the Public Safety Complex 20 George Bennett Rd, Lee.

You must call Strafford County Community Action at 516-8126 for an appointment. If you are unable to make an appointment for October 18th, call the number above to make an appointment for another day. Winter will be here before we know it!!!
