LEE SELECT BOARD APPROVES PILOT AGREEMENT WITH DURHAM FOR THE SOLAR ARRAY PROJECT AT PACKERS FALLS GRAVEL PIT

Fourteen people spoke at the Lee Public Hearing on October 12th. The Town of Lee expects to receive more than \$120,000 over the next 20 years through this agreement. The Durham Town Council is having its own Public Hearing on October 19th on the Payment in Lieu of Taxes, the terms of the Power Purchase Agreement, and the lease agreement. All of these things need to be approved in order for the project to move forward.

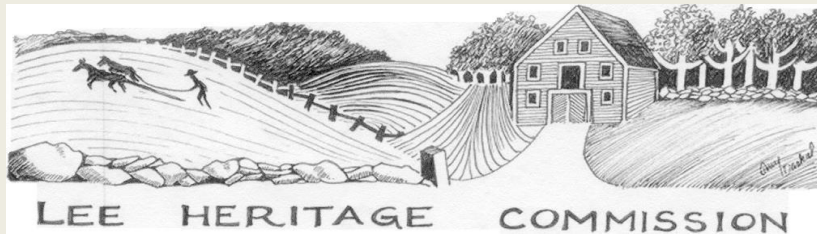

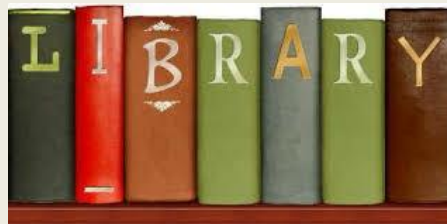


EVERY KID IN A PARK INITIATIVE

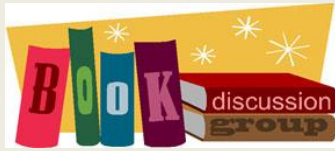

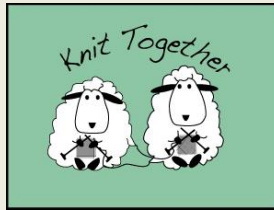
