### **VOTER ID LAW IS STILL IN PLACE**

The recent action by the NH Supreme Court does **not** change the new Voter ID requirements passed by lawmakers earlier this year, according to Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlan.

IT requires anyone voting to show a driver's license or other acceptable identification at the polling place on November 6th. Those who do not have such an ID will be asked to sign a "challenged voter affidavit" but will still be allowed to vote.

What was affected is the voter registration requirement imposed upon college students, among others, which has been suspended until sometime after the November 6<sup>th</sup> election. That law required those registering to vote to declare NH as their domicile, and be subject to the laws of the state of NH, including laws requiring a driver to register a motor vehicle and apply for a NH driver's license within 60 days of becoming a resident.

# CURRENT USE BOARD PROPOSES LOWER RATES FOR 2013, SCHEDULES PUBLIC FORUMS

Proposed ranges for Current Use assessments are significantly lower in some categories.
