DURHAM TOWN COUNCIL VOTES IN FAVOR OF PILOT AGREEMENT WITH LEE FOR THE SOLAR ARRAY PROJECT AT PACKERS FALLS GRAVEL PIT (8-1)

On Monday, October 19th the Durham Town Council approved a proposal in which Durham would make an annual payment of \$6,257 to the Town of Lee for the next 20 years, which totals \$125,140. In addition, Durham will pay an estimated \$10,000 in building permit fees.



HISTORY OF THE CONCORD COACHES Tuesday, November 10TH, 7:00 pm Public Safety Complex

The Lee Historical Society and the Library presents a program by C. Peter James, Treasurer and Educator for the Albert-Downing Historical Society of Concord, formerly known as The Concord Coach Society. The mission of the Society is to educate people about the significance of the Concord Coach and its relationship to our history and lives today. Mr. James will talk about the beautifully crafted coaches that, at one time, took travelers through Lee and other communities. There were many stops along the way, most at taverns still standing today as private homes. A total of 1,700 or so coaches were built between 1826 and 1899. Only 157 remain today, with 18 of those in New Hampshire. The program is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served at the end of the program.


EVERY KID IN A PARK INITIATIVE


