VOTER REGISTRATION THIS WEEKEND!

The Supervisors of the Checklist will meet on October 27, 2012 at the Lee Town Hall from 11:00 to 11:30 am. This is the last day for Town Clerk/Supervisors to accept voter registration applications. No additions or corrections will be made to the checklist after this session, until State General Election day on November 6, 2012. *New voters may register at the polls.*

HURRICANE SANDY IS HEADING NORTH

It now appears that Hurricane Sandy will hit the East Coast. The effects will probably be felt in NH beginning on Monday. Emergency responders are encouraging New Englanders to start preparing for a possible landfall in the coming days. The American Red Cross suggests stocking up on water, nonperishable food, medications, a first aid kit, flashlights, radios, extra batteries, extra cash and copies of important documents and contact information.

The NH Homeland Security Director Chris Pope said his office is already going through its hurricane checklist, following steps four days before landfall. "We have to really look at a reasonable worst-case scenario, because the time to prepare is not 24 hours in advance or six hours in advance. We want people getting ready now," Pope said.

Utility companies are already putting extra crews on standby, even from faraway states.

VOTER ID LAW IS STILL IN PLACE

The recent action by the NH Supreme Court does **not** change the new Voter ID requirements passed by lawmakers earlier this year, according to Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlan.

IT requires anyone voting to show a driver's license or other acceptable identification at the polling place on November 6th. Those who do not have such an ID will be asked to sign a "challenged voter affidavit" but will still be allowed to vote.

DELIBERATIVE SESSION FOR ARTIFICIAL TURF

Over 100 registered voters from Lee passionately deliberated the citizens' petition for artificial turf at Little River Park last night at the Mast Way School.

The original petition was amended as follows: *To see if the* Town will install an artificial turf field at Little River Park, provided that funding for the added costs of installation above those of installation of natural grass can be raised through donations within twenty four (24) months of the date of passage of this Town vote; to landscape the installed artificial turf field in an aesthetically pleasing manner to the satisfaction of the Board of Selectmen; to use the rock currently at Little River Park as part of the installation which was purchased following a 2010 warrant article, and to maintain the field as a competition level playing field for sports such as soccer, football, lacrosse and field hockey provided that any costs for such management and maintenance, including replacement costs, be secured through general taxation and/or offsetting revenues which may include fees and charges from the use of Little River Park.

To vote on this issue, the Second Session (Ballot Vote) will be held on **Thursday, November 29**th. Polls are open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm at the Safety Complex on George Bennett Rd.
