VOTER ID LAW IS STILL IN PLACE

The recent action by the New Hampshire Supreme Court does **not** change the new Voter ID requirements passed by lawmakers earlier this year, according to Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlan.

It requires anyone voting to show a driver's license or other acceptable identification at the polling place on November 6th. Those who do not have such an ID will be asked to sign a "challenged voter affidavit" but will still be allowed to vote.

TAX RATE SETTING

On Wednesday, October 31, 2012 the Board of Selectmen, the Town Treasurer and the Town Administrator met with the Department of Revenue Administration to set the tax rate for 2012.

The 2012 tax rate is \$29.94 per thousand. With the Town Rate being \$6.67, Local School Rate \$18.22, State School Rate \$2.41 and the County Rate \$2.64. Tax bills are expected to be mailed to property owners on Saturday, November 10th and due on Wednesday, December 12th.

DELIBERATIVE SESSION FOR ARTIFICIAL TURF

On October 25, 2012 over 100 registered voters from Lee passionately deliberated and amended the citizens' petition for artificial turf at Little River Park.

To vote on this issue, the Second Session (Ballot Vote) will be held on **Thursday**, **Nov 29th**. The polls are open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm at the Safety Complex on George Bennett Rd.

The original petition was amended as follows:

To see if the Town will install an artificial turf field at Little River Park, provided that funding for the added costs of installation above those of installation of natural grass can be raised through donations within twenty four (24) months of the date of passage of this Town vote; to landscape the installed artificial turf field in an aesthetically pleasing manner to the satisfaction of the Board of Selectmen; to use the rock currently at Little River Park as part of the installation which was purchased following a 2010 warrant article, and to maintain the field as a competition level playing field for sports such as soccer, football, lacrosse and field hockey provided that any costs for such management and maintenance, including replacement costs, be secured through general taxation and/or offsetting revenues which may include fees and charges from the use of Little River Park.
