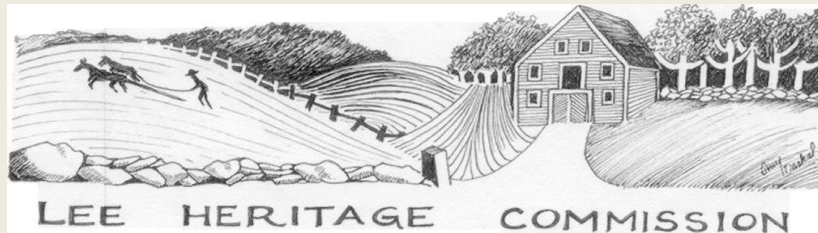

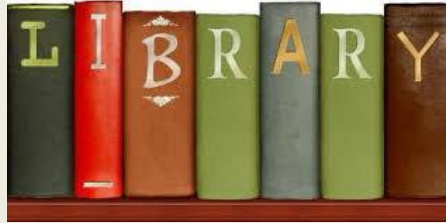


EVERY KID IN A PARK INITIATIVE
