The Second Session (Ballot Vote) will be held on **Thursday**, **November 29<sup>th</sup>.** Polls are open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm at the Safety Complex on George Bennett Road.

The original petition was amended as follows: To see if the Town will install an artificial turf field at Little River Park, provided that funding for the added costs of installation above those of installation of natural grass can be raised through donations within twenty four (24) months of the date of passage of this Town vote; to landscape the installed artificial turf field in an aesthetically pleasing manner to the satisfaction of the Board of Selectmen; to use the rock currently at Little River Park as part of the installation which was purchased following a 2010 warrant article, and to maintain the field as a competition level playing field for sports such as soccer, football, lacrosse and field hockey provided that any costs for such management and maintenance, including replacement costs, be secured through general taxation and/or offsetting revenues which may include fees and charges from the use of Little River Park.

This notification is part of a joint plan by Pawtuckaway Lake Improvement Association (PLIA) and the Department of Environmental Services (DES.) PLIA and DES conceived an idea to demonstrate the winter water level conditions proposed in the draft Lamprey Water Management Plan by pausing annual fall drawdown at this level for approximately 48 hours. The proposed water level is 4.82 feet below the full pool level.
