POWDER MAJOR FARM & FOREST AN EXCITING CONSERVATION OPPORTUNITY

A remarkable property in Lee, Madbury and Durham is planned for protection by the Society for the Protection of NH Forests. Working with the three towns, the Forest Society is planning to purchase and conserve 195 acres of forest lands and further to protect an abutting 32 acres of farmland.

The Powder Major property has an extensive trail system for a wide variety of public recreation activities. The Oyster River, a drinking water source for UNH and Durham, travels for half a mile through the property. There is also a variety of important wildlife habitat. Historically, the property is noted for "Council Rock" where Chief Moharimet and early European settlers met. And during the Revolutionary War, the farm was owned by Major John Demeritt who became known as the "Powder Major" after he helped bring gunpowder to the Continental Army at the Battle of Bunker Hill.

FAMILY NATURE WALK AT LEE TOWN FOREST Saturday, December 12th, 9:30 am



For many of us the holidays are so busy there's little time to enjoy them. A walk in the Town Forest is the perfect way to slow things down and take time to appreciate the season. Apart from the benefits of exercise and fresh air, a walk in the woods may have other health benefits as well. In Japan, walks in the woods are known as shinrin-yoku, which translates to "forest bathing," and studies there have shown that a walk in the woods can result in decreased blood pressure and stress levels and increased heart health. While the exercise involved in any walk can account for some of these health benefits, studies comparing city walkers with woods walkers showed the woods walkers to have greater decreases in blood pressure and stress levels than city walkers. One study speculated that forest flora and fungi produce aerosols that may play a role in these health benefits. Join us for some pre-holiday shinrin-yoku as we walk the red triangle trail in the Town Forest on Saturday December 12th. Besides lowering our blood pressure and stress levels and easing our hearts, we'll learn about some of the hardy evergreens that brighten the forest floor, look at an old orchard that reverting to forest and pay a visit to the magical wishing tree.

Family nature walks are sponsored by the Lee Conservation Commission and the Senior Advisory Committee. We'll meet at 9:30 at the red triangle trailhead behind the ball field backstop.


