

REMEMBER THAT LEE HAS A SNOW CASTING ORDINANCE!

This means that you cannot throw, "cast," place or deposit snow or ice onto any plowed street or public way. <u>CLICK HERE</u> to read more. The fine for this violation can be up to \$100.00.The Lee Police will also be strictly enforcing RSA 265:79-b Negligent Driving or otherwise known as "Jessica's Law" for drivers who do not clear the snow off of their vehicles. The fines are \$250-\$500 for the first offense and \$500-\$1000 for subsequent offenses.

Also, please be sure that no vehicles are parked on a roadway during snow removal. Let's help our new Highway Supervisor Steve Bullek, Warren, Peter and the rest of the people who plow this season.

LEE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

It's time to think about going camping next summer!

Once again the Lee Conservation Commission will sponsor a campership to Barry Conservation Camp, at the fish hatchery in Berlin, NH. We hear enthusiastic reports from the Lee young people who have been able to enjoy a week at the Camp. The 4-H camp is operated in conjunction with the NH Department of Fish & Game. "Barry Conservation Camp emphasizes environmental awareness, responsible use of firearms, safe hunting practices, conservation principles and ethics." There is swimming and canoeing, as well as group activities that encourage teamwork.

Lee youngsters, ages 10 & up, are eligible for this campership. 

TIMELY TOPICS FOR DECEMBER

With winter approaching your fire department would like to remind everyone to consider these recommended safety practices so that everyone can have a safe and happy holiday.

- Artificial Christmas trees are recommended but if you prefer a live tree, keep it watered and check it daily for dryness. If the needles easily fall off or turn brown, we recommend removing the tree from the residence to prevent a fire.
- Inspect all strands of lights before decorating your tree and discard any lights that are damaged or show signs of wear. Do not overload electrical outlets with plugs and limit use of extension cords.
- If you burn wood in your home, have chimneys inspected and cleaned yearly to prevent chimney fires. When burning wood do not burn wood that is green or unseasoned.
- Have furnace cleaned and serviced yearly especially if it burns oil, Kerosene or a blend.
- Clear snow from all outside vents and gas meters.
- Carbon Monoxide detectors are recommended on each floor of the residence especially in the hallway outside any bedroom areas. Test them weekly and make sure they have good batteries in them.
- Clear snow from all exterior exits to allow for quick evacuation in the event of an emergency.

CARBON MONOXIDE WARNING

It is important to remember that carbon monoxide poisoning is a deadly threat within your home and is particularly dangerous because we cannot see, smell or taste it. Symptoms of CO poisoning can mimic viruses such as cold or flu and may include headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, sleepiness, and confusion. If you suspect CO poisoning, go outside immediately and then call 9-1-1.

Hundreds of people die accidentally every year from CO poisoning and many times it is caused by a malfunctioning or improperly used fuel-burning furnace or appliance and over a third of CO-related deaths happen when victims are sleeping. This is all the more reason why everyone should install a carbon monoxide detector (CMD) in their home, apartment or condo.

WHEN SECONDS COUNT...

Can the Police, Fire, or Ambulance find your home when you need them for assistance with an emergency? Can they find it at night? Can they find it during a snowstorm?

Having your name and number on a mailbox is just not enough. Some mailboxes are clustered together. The numbers are small and the location may not mark the entrance to your driveway.

The Lee Firemen's Association, in a joint effort with the Lee Fire Department, has started a program to install reflective house number signs at driveway entrances to assist all emergency responders in locating your home in a time of need.

The cost for each sign with a post is \$30.00 and it will be installed by the Lee Firemen's Association.


WILKINSON FOOD PANTRY Lee Church Congregational 17 Mast Rd




BOOKS ALIVE Tuesdays 3:30 pm
