# A BIT OF HISTORY

LEE NEWS From the Newmarket Advertiser April 21, 1927: "Among the many fires was the one in Madbury and Lee. It was started by a brush fire. The house formerly owned by Martha Pierce was destroyed. There was approximately **1500** Fire Fighters there and **200** watched all night. Sandwiches and hot coffee were served to the night watchers". (note: 1930 Census shows 376 for the population of Lee)
