LEE PUBLIC LIBRARY COMMUNITY CENTER UPDATE

The Building Committee continues to work on details for the plans to build a space to meet the needs of our community with both a new library and community center!

Route 155 has been surveyed and the entrance meets state guidelines of 400 feet of visibility in both directions with no major tree cutting necessary. Our conversations with NH Department of Transportation will continue and we hope to have conceptual approval for the entrance soon. We are exploring heating system options and associated operating costs.

Dennis Mires, the architect, has developed floor plans with dimensions of the rooms which are available on our website and in the library. 
LEE HISTORICAL SOCIETY DID YOU ATTEND A SCHOOL IN LEE?
