As it stands, 3% of Eversource customers in Lee are still without power - that is about 48 customers. Though the vast majority of customers now have power, crews will continue to work into the night. We will start focusing on these smaller individual incidents beginning tomorrow.

NHEC 8:23 a.m.

At the start of the 5th day of power restoration following the October 30th storm which knocked out power to more than 52,000 members at the height of the storm, approximately 4,000 Co-op members remained without power. NHEC crews, New Hampshire-based contract crews and line crews from New York, Virginia, Ohio and Illinois will be working in the 75 towns that are still reporting outages. The majority of these towns have fewer than five members without power. There are 3 customers left from NHEC that are without power this morning.

NH Homeland Security & Emergency Management Director Perry Plummer asks the owners of homes or businesses that sustained damage as result of the October 29th - 30th storm to report the damage to 2-1-1 or 1-866-444-4211.
