AGREEMENT FOR FIREWORKS DISPLAY

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this <u>28th</u> day of <u>July</u> <u>2016</u>, by and between <u>RS Fireworks LLC</u>, whose principal place of business is 4 Old Nashua Road, Londonderry, New Hampshire 03053, sometimes hereinafter referred to as <u>Provider</u>; and <u>City Town of Lee</u>, <u>7 Mast Road</u>, <u>LEE</u>, <u>NH 03861</u> sometimes hereinafter referred to as <u>Client</u>, <u>WITNESSETH</u>:

WHEREAS, RS Fireworks, LLC was the successful bidder for pyrotechnic displays (hereafter "fireworks displays") to be performed and displayed on **September 10th, 2016** with a (rain date of **TBD, 2016**)

WHEREAS, RS Fireworks, LLC is to perform the fireworks displays in a manner consistent with the highest degree of care with respect to the safety of viewers and improvements located in the area where the fireworks will be set off, and

WHEREAS, in exchange for RS Fireworks, LLC performing the fireworks display for 2016 RS Fireworks, LLC shall be entitled to the payment of the successfully bid amount of \$8,000 inclusive of tax, payable as hereafter provided. A 50% deposit will be paid at date of signing in the amount of \$4,000. This deposit is non-refundable and will reserve the product for the given display, or for the rescheduled display in the event of any number of cancellations / postponements due to weather. Client agrees to use RS Fireworks, LLC for any fireworks display in 2016.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Provider's responsibilities with respect to fireworks display: Provider agrees to provide all necessary fireworks, fireworks display materials, and the personnel necessary to perform the fireworks displays in accordance with the bid previously submitted by Provider. The bid submitted by provider to Client is hereby incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A. Provider shall take all steps reasonably necessary to safeguard the improvements or other property in the area of the displays other than the issues for which Client is responsible. Provider shall provide qualified pyro-technicians who will deliver, set up, execute and take down the fireworks displays. The pyrotechnicians shall conduct a thorough search of the grounds after the displays in an effort to locate and dispose of any unexploded fireworks[JGI]. The scope and extent of such search shall be dependent upon the weather conditions, time of the completion of the display, etc. Provider shall comply with all local, state, and federal guidelines pertaining to the storing and displaying of fireworks, and obtain all necessary permits and shall be responsible for the cost thereof.
- 2. <u>Client's responsibilities with respect to fireworks displays</u>: Client agrees to (a) provide a sufficient area for the displays, including a minimum spectator set

back as determined by Provider, (b) provide protection of the display area to prevent unrestricted access by unauthorized persons by a means it shall determine is adequately designed for that purpose, (c) arrange adequate police or other protection to prevent spectators from entering the display area, administer proper crowd control, parking supervision, etc., and (d) arrange fire protection and emergency medical care for the health and safety of spectators and the public.

- 3. <u>Compensation to Provider</u>: Client shall pay to Provider the remaining balance amount of \$4.000. The sum shall be paid to Provider <u>subsequent to performance of this agreement</u>. on the date of the display. [JG2]Any balance that is not paid at the time it within one week of the event becomes due shall bear interest at 15% per annum.
- 4. Weather, election to postpone/cancel: The parties understand that weather may prevent the ability to perform the fireworks displays. In the event inclement weather is present on the day the display is scheduled to occur, the event may be canceled by mutual agreement by the parties. The fireworks displays shall not be performed in the event any government body or agency with authority in regard to the fireworks displays shall direct, in writing or otherwise, that the displays should not occur, and there shall be no financial liability for cancellation under this paragraph.
- 5. <u>Insurance</u>: Provider is required to provide at its expense liability insurance coverage to cover liability associated with the fireworks displays[JG3] in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,4000,000 aggregate. Those entities/individuals listed on the certificate of insurance shall be deemed The Town of Lee, its officials and employees shall be included in the coverage as an additional insured by way of certificate and endorsement per this contract. Provider shall provide worker's compensation insurance on its employees. Provider shall provide proof that the foregoing insurance requirements have been satisfied prior to performing services.

6. Liability:

- a. <u>Performance</u>: Provider shall not be liable for any faulty performance of equipment or products that could not reasonably have been <u>foreseen or</u> discovered prior to the commencement of the fireworks displays. Provider shall use its best efforts to ensure that the displays will proceed safely and as planned.
- b. <u>Harm to third parties or property</u>: Provider shall not be liable for harm to any spectators, third parties, or improvements or property in the vicinity of the fireworks displays <u>unless it or its employees or agents</u>

were except for negligentee.[JG4] Provider covenants that it will use its best efforts to avoid any such harm and that it will obtain insurance coverage to cover any such harm pursuant to the foregoing section.

- c. <u>Indemnification</u>: Provider agrees to <u>defend</u>, indemnify and hold <u>harmless</u> Client, its officials and employees, including but not limited to reasonable attorney's fees, expenses and costs, harmless for from and against any <u>demands</u>, claims, suits, actions and liabilitiesy for <u>damages</u>, costs, expenses, penalties and fees suffered byte third parties eaused arising in whole or in part fromby a failure by Client the acts or omissions of Provider, its employees or agents in connection with the performance of services under this agreement to perform its obligations hereunder.
- 7. No partnership or joint venture: The parties agree that Provider is an independent sub—contractor and that there is no employment relationship, partnership or joint venture between the parties. The manner and means of providing the displays is left to the sole discretion of Provider.

General Provisions

- 1. <u>Binding Effect on Representatives and Successors:</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the representatives, heirs, estates, and successors and assigns to the parties hereto.
- 2. <u>Entire Agreement:</u> This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the transaction contemplated herein. Each party acknowledges that it is not relying upon any representation made by the other party unless such representation is contained in this Agreement. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same agreement.
- 3. <u>Choice of Law and Forum:</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the <u>State of New Hampshire</u>. Any suit under the terms of this agreement may only be brought in the <u>Rockingham Strafford County-</u>, New Hampshire.
- 4. <u>Assignment:</u> Without the prior written consent of the other party, neither party shall:
 - A. Assign, transfer, pledge or hypothecate this agreement, the property or any part thereof, or any interest therein;
 - B. Sublet or lend the property or any part thereof.
- 5. <u>Modification:</u> Subsequent amendments, modifications, or releases from any provision of this agreement shall be binding only if in writing and signed by all parties.
 - 6. <u>Time of Essence</u>: Time is of the essence of this agreement.
 - 7. Severability: If any provision of this agreement is held invalid by a court of

We believe that such an ordinance is unnecessary. State law (RSA 466:31) provides the Town with the authority to discipline a dog, and its owner, if it is a nuisance and not under the control of its owner. We believe that a leash is by no means necessary for a dog owner to control his/her dog, and that this is true for Town-owned conservation lands as well as elsewhere in the Town.

At its meeting last night, the Select Board reviewed a draft "Leash Law" that I had been asked to prepare (copy attached). During the

discussion, I mentioned that I did not see anything in Lee's Cemetery Rule and Regulations regarding dogs but that the Cemetery Trustees should be asked their opinion, which is why I am reaching out to you.

Please let me know if are interested in restricting dogs completely in Town-owned cemeteries (which some towns do, except for service dogs); if you want the "leash law" to require dogs to be on leash while in Town-owned cemeteries; or something else.

The Select Board will be discussing this again at its Aug.15th meeting. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.
