Re: Tree Selection and Planting at LRP

Per the direction of the BOS on Monday, August 14, 2017, the Recreation Commission (comprising of the Chairman only as all of the commissioners were on vacation), met with members of the Conservation Commission and Mark Davis of Pawtuckaway Nursery at Little River Park to discuss the selection of trees and their placement.

It was agreed to make the following changes from the original proposal:

Remove: 2 Greenspire Linden, 2 Prairiefire Crabapple, and 2 Chanticleer Pear trees.

Add: 3 Red Sunset Maple and 2 Autumn Brilliance trees.

All were in agreement with the placement of the trees with the exception of the Pin Oak near the pavilion due to interference with the pig roast fire pit used at the fair. The placement of this tree will be changed to a more suitable location.

The final quote for the changes is attached and represents a larger Pin Oak tree than originally proposed.

Dear Julie,

On August 9, 2017 I conducted an on-site risk assessment at the Town's solid waste management facility along with facility manager, Toby Van Aken. This assessment was done at your and Toby's request as a proactive step to improve safety and risk management at the facility.

The layout, traffic patterns and processes used in Lee are similar to what I find at some other facilities in NH. In fact, I remarked to Mr. Van Aken that the Lee facility is better than many in terms of processes and safety. That said, there is room for improvement particularly with regard to traffic management in and around the site. I am particularly focused on areas where vehicles and pedestrians mix as there is an obvious potential for conflict.

Mr. Van Aken and I walked the facility and brainstormed various ideas to enhance safety in and around the site. I have captured these ideas as recommendations on the attached pages and I would ask that these be considered as soon as possible. Please keep me updated on progress by completing the shaded response box following each recommendation and returning a copy to my attention no later than October 27, 2013.

I remain available and welcome any questions. Thanks for your continued focus on managing risks in Lee.

TOWN OF LEE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY RISK MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

2017-01: Re-Paint Traffic Markings:

Repaint all traffic flow, parking and lane delineation markings throughout the facility. These markings should be highly visible and should be repainted as needed to maintain visibility and appearance.

Since this is an industrial area yellow markings are better suited to delineate traffic flow areas from pedestrian walking areas rather than white markings. Markings should be bold and may be enhanced with signs and other warnings as recommended further in this report.

2017-02: Demolition Debris Off-Load Area Enhancements:

Improve the off-load area for demolition debris. The debris is dropped into a roll off container below grade. When not full, the drop is some 10+ feet below and better protection should be afforded to residents dropping material into the roll off containers. Among the recommendations is repainting the top of the wall yellow, marking the top of the wall with language that reads **CAUTION** and installing a movable barrier (see example below) that could be moved for large loads or dump equipped vehicles.

2017-03: Pedestrian Safety Enhancements:

Provide additional warnings and controls in and around the facility where conflict exists between motor vehicles and pedestrians dropping off trash and/or recyclables. Included would be:

- Signs at the entrance to the drive-thru bays reading CAUTION – PEDESTRIANS or similar language. The sign should be yellow in color with black lettering similar to the sign shown here.
- Installation of a flashing amber beacon above and/or below the sign to add emphasis to the need to drive slowly and to be alert for moving pedestrian traffic across the travel lanes.
- Use of speed bumps at strategic locations. The speed bumps need to be highly visible and signage is required to notify drivers of the speed bump locations.

2017-04: Processing Floor – Employees Only:


Implement controls to make sure that only employees or escorted/permitted individuals are allowed on the processing floor. This is the lower area with balers, moving skid steer style loaders and other processing equipment. This is not an area for public access as there are many dangers including heavy equipment and moving industrial machines. Signs and barriers can help to limit access and are recommended for the top of the stairs just outside the office door and at the lower garage door entry areas adjacent to the swap shop and bulky waste drop off areas.

2017-05: Loading Dock Safety:

Improve safety of the loading dock that is outside the rear of the main processing building. The loading dock currently presents a serious fall hazard and should be addressed in a similar way to the roll-off containers described in recommendation 2017-02. That would include repainting the leading edge of the loading dock yellow and installing some sort of movable barrier (see example below) that could be moved when in use but would provide for fall protection when not in use.

2017-06: Movable Safety Signs – Site Locations:

Actions Taken (or to be taken):

Expand the use of movable yard/site safety signs. Signs can slow traffic, delineate parking areas and can warn of pedestrians. These signs, when in place, along with pavement markings and other information signs can enhance site safety and flow. Movable signs are suggested to aid in snow removal and to allow for layout flexibility as site demands and operations may change from time to time.

Dear Highway Safety Partner,

Upon conducting an annual review of our 2017 STEP grant programs, it has come to our attention that a considerable number of agencies, which were awarded a STEP Grant for the current 2017 grant period, unfortunately did not fully comply with the terms of the grant agreement, due to the fact that in order to remain in compliance for the year, the following milestones had to have been met:

- 1. Participation in one or more patrols during the "Join the NH Clique" enforcement event for the year which occurred between May 22nd and June 4th.
- 2. Participation in the one "Border to Border" enforcement event for the year, which took place on May 22nd,
- 3. Participation in the pre-determined "Operation Safe Commute" enforcement date each month.

In order to ensure that all participating agencies receive the appropriate reimbursements for past enforcement details worked during this period, the Office of Highway Safety and our NHTSA Partners have identified a solution to rectify this situation, which consists simply of every partner agency signing the attached 2017 STEP grant agreement amended EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT C-1, as a no cost modification and returning it via mail to the New Hampshire Office of Highway Safety, 33 Hazen Drive Concord, NH 03305, by August 31, 2017. Two signatures are required on these documents. Please verify that whoever signed the original contract must sign the modification as well.

Please know that failure to sign this 2017 STEP grant agreement amended EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT C-1 to bring your agency into compliance may result in the following:

- Non-payment for patrols conducted; and/or
- Monetary payback for patrols conducted by the non-compliant agency

In the future, the Office of Highway Safety will provide additional training and will increase communication to better inform our highway safety partners of important information within our grant agreements so that the terms of the grants are easily understood.

As always, please know that the Office of Highway Safety values our partnerships with all of the agencies around the state and we look forward to working collaboratively to improve the safety on our roadways throughout New Hampshire.

It is agreed that quarterly reports will be made to the Office of Highway Safety for the duration of the contract summarizing the progress being made in implementing the project and identifying any problems being encountered. A final report will be made upon completion of the project. Reports will be submitted within 20 days of the project termination date.
- 3. All publications, public information or publicity released in conjunction with this project shall state that "this project is being supported in part through a grant from the Office of Highway Safety with Federal funds provided by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, US Department of Transportation", or words to that effect.

Scope of Services for Traffic Enforcement Grants

- Departments may conduct patrols during any time that data indicate there is an increased risk for the driving behavior being combatted. OHS strongly encourages departments to review their local crash data to determine times and locations where grant-funded patrols would have the greatest impact. In the absence of data regarding times of day, the STEP patrols should be conducted during commuter hours. DUI patrols can be worked between 1800-0300. However, it is recommended that at least 50% be from 2100-0300.
- DUI patrol shifts are encouraged to be 6 hours in length.
- STEP and Pedestrian/Bicycle patrols are encouraged to be 3-4 hours in length.
- Departments with DWI enforcement grants are strongly encouraged to conduct patrol(s) during the two national Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over (DSGPO) Mobilizations (December 15, 2016-January 1, 2017 and August 18-September 3,
- Departments with STEP grants are strongly encouraged to conduct patrol(s) during the "Join the NH Clique" which coincides with the national Click It or Ticket Mobilization (May 22-June 4, 2017) and Border to Border Operation (May 22, 2017), and Operation Safe Commute. See Operation Safe Commute dates below.
- Join the NH Clique must be conducted during daylight hours and it's recommended they be at locations such as elementary schools, high schools, shopping centers, and any other locations where children will be located.
- Departments with PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLE enforcement grants shall conduct overtime patrols aimed at enforcing the state's pedestrian/bicycle laws. Patrols will be conducted year round with a focus on the summer months primarily in downtown locations during the evening commuting hours.
- All departments with a STEP grant are strongly encouraged to participate in the Operation Safe Commute NH statewide effort (October 7, 2016, November 23, 2016, December 31, 2016, January 13, 2017, February 17, 2017, March 17, 2017, April 13, 2017, May 26, 2017, June 9, 2017, June 30, 2017, August 8, 2017, September 1, 2017).
- Operation Safe Commute patrols will consist of 3 or 4-hour shifts in either the morning or afternoon commute on the dates specified above.
- Officers funded during these enforcement grants shall be dedicated in total to traffic law enforcement, except in the case of a criminal offense committed in the officer's presence, in the case of response to an officer in distress, or in the case of a riot where all available personnel must divert their attention.
- Officers may pull over drivers for any driving offense during patrols. This includes, but is not limited to, suspected drunk driving, speeding, school bus violations, CPS violations, red light/stop sign running, and distracted driving.
- If an officer makes an arrest during the shift, but does not complete the arrest before the shift is scheduled to end, the officer can continue working under the grant to complete that arrest even if the time exceeds the six-hour shift limit. However, the total request for reimbursement must not exceed the approved budget.
- Enforcement Grants are for overtime enforcement only.
- Departments will be reimbursed for actual hours worked.
- Full time officers will be reimbursed at an overtime rate of pay as established by the department and/or municipality for hours worked during the mobilizations. Part-time officers will be reimbursed at their normal hourly rate of pay.
- The Reimbursement form must be signed and dated by an (the Chief or another) Authorized Signatory. (Individuals working the enforcement patrol may not sign off on the Reimbursement form (HS-20). If the Chief works the enforcement patrol, a community official must sign off on the Reimbursement form (HS-20). In addition, the Chief may not sign off on the Reimbursement form (HS-20) if his/her spouse, child or sibling works the same enforcement
- Departments are recommended to conduct a minimum of three documented stops/contacts per hour. Please note that documented stops/contacts do not necessarily have to result in the issuance of a summons. stops/contacts are defined as any grant-funded patrol officer contact with motorists during traffic enforcement periods that can be supported by written or electronic records maintained at the police department. These records must be maintained in a manner that guarantees their accountability during a review or monitoring site visit.
- If patrols result in few traffic stops, please provide an explanation on the Activity Report as to why an officer was unable to make the recommended number of stops (poor weather, for example).

The Intent must be signed by the municipal assessing officials and an operation number assigned prior to distribution. <u>DISTRIBUTION</u> : The original, signed copy is retained by the municipal assessing officials; a copy to the Owner, a copy to the Logger, and a copy to the Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) by <u>Mail</u> to: PO Box 487 Concord NH 03302-0487; by <u>E-mail</u> to: timber@dra.nh.gov or by <u>Fax to</u> : (603) 230-5943.
WHO MUST PAY	After Form PA-8, Report of Wood or Timber Cut (Report), is submitted to the municipality, a tax bill will be issued to the owner and payment shall be remitted directly to the municipality. The Timber Tax is a 10% tax on the stumpage value at the time of cutting.
REPORT & CERTIFICATE	Once the Intent has been signed and an operation number assigned, appropriate copies shall be forwarded by the municipality to the owner and the DRA. After the copy of the Intent has been received by the DRA, a Report and a Certificate will be issued by the DRA to the individual indicated on Line 6. The Certificate should be posted in a conspicuous place within the area of the cutting.

(5) A person who cuts or causes to be cut, within the tax year, up to 10,000 board feet of logs and 20 cords of wood or the equivalent in whole tree chips, from the person's own land within a municipality, for land conversion purposes other than timber growing and forest uses, provided that those persons intending to convert the use of the land have secured all required permits including, but not limited to, building permits, subdivision or zoning permits, excavation permits, or site plan approvals, as necessary for the use to which the land will be converted, and are able to furnish proof of such permits.
