

## SENIOR ADVISORY COMMITTEE MINUTES, JULY 9, 2012

Meeting held between 9:00 and 10:00 AM at the Safety Complex.

Jacquie suggested that we send a thank you note to the Lee Church Congregational for their gift of left-over plants from their Spring Plant Sale. It was our first fund raiser and benefited our group \$192.50. The note sent to the attention of M. Banks and B. Brady.

Frank was not able to stay for the whole meeting and asked again for someone to take over the chairperson's position—Dawn kindly volunteered.

Several community members, committee members have volunteered to hold free classes for seniors in the fall: Carolyn West, art class (our suggestions was a note card class.), Sharon Taylor will coordinate with her to find out class size; Jacquie Neill will teach a ceramic painting class with students all choosing the same green ware, she will order, will fire, and students will paint.
