MINUTES OF THE TRUSTEES MEETING

Held at the Library

Minutes of last meeting: Accepted.

Finances/ Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was accepted. As of 2/9, the operating budget was \$9364; the balance in the non-lapsing account was \$984.04; and there is \$4,185.14 in the Special Projects Fund.

Public Hearing RSA 202-A:4c to accept donations

The board moved into public session to accept a monetary donation of \$1000 given to the library by David and Tricia Prince. The trustees agreed to add the amount to their existing CD, or use it to open a new one.

Old Business:

Warrant Article Presentation. The trustees met with Paul Gasowski to discuss the Library/Community Center video he is working on to be shown at the public information session on March 2 and Town Meeting on March 9.

FY 2011-2012 Budget. There were no changes to the library budget; the warrant articles have been approved and will be voted on at Town Meeting.

New Business:

Other. The trustees will prepare an article about the new Library/Community Center capital reserve fund and the 3/2 public information session for the next issue of the Bookworm.

The trustees agreed that since Town Meeting begins at 6:30 this year, library will close at 6:30 so that Lisa and the staff can attend. Staff scheduled to work at that time can either come in early, or take a cut in pay.

The trustees agreed to schedule a work session to continue the discussion on the video presentation and handouts on Wednesday, Feb, 16, at Peg Dolan's home – providing everyone's schedule allows.

### Program Attendance for January 2011

- Children's Programs: **14 programs** offered, attended by **234 patrons** (11 programs offered, attended by 239 patrons in 2010)
- Adult Programs: **7 programs** offered, attended by **66 patrons** (3 programs offered, attended by 45 patrons in 2010).

Adult programs included sock knitting and rug braiding workshops; First Aid Certification, motorcycle program, as well as monthly book discussion group and visit to Kirkwood corners. Children programs included Saturday craft activity, weekly story times and afterschool programs, and monthly book discussion group and Dog Days program. School Vacation week program featuring singer Judy Pancoast attended by 115 people (program offered jointly with Madbury and Durham Libraries)

### Friends of the Lee Public Library

Friends have a new banner to advertise their presence at town events/fundraisers. Friends approved renewal of the Museum of Science and Boston Children's Museum passes. Friends approved purchase of support materials for the Summer Reading Program.

## Other

- A representative from the NH Dept. of Labor paid a surprise visit to the library in early March. No violations were noted for the Library.
- Several Library employees participated in an eight week weight loss program sponsored by the Joint/Loss Safety Management Committee. Grant money was used to purchase food and toiletry supplies that reflected the total amount of pounds lost by the group, which was then donated to the Wilkinson Food Pantry at the Lee Church Congregational. Almost 90lbs. of food was donated to the pantry last Friday and participants gathered at the Library for a group photo that will be featured in the Local Government Center's newsletter.
- Lisa attended the CHILIS (Children Librarians of NH) spring conference on behalf of Scottie on Thursday, March 17. A performer's showcase was the highlight of the day, featuring storytellers, musicians and other performers eligible for funding through the Kids , Books and the Arts grant as part of the summer reading program
- Two teens have submitted photographs for this year's *Tell the Story of Winter* exhibit, on display through March
- Lisa has begun working on the NH State Library's FY09/10 annual report, due on April 30.
