Library: May events for adults began at the Complex with the talented Jeff Warner and his "Banjos, Bones and Ballads," funded with a grant from the Humanities Council. Our partnership with the Lee Historical Society continues to work well in procuring excellent presenters. Local resident, Deborah Sisson shared her experiences bicycling in India. Another local resident, Ginger Johnson, shared her expertise in children's and young adult literature. Master gardeners Annie Gasowski, and Jean Olsen shared their gardening wisdom with eager learners. Teens and parents came to find out what the FBI expects from new recruits. The programs for seniors began in May. Children's programs are on hiatus until the summer reading kick-off, June 29. The theme for the summer reading program is "Dream Big, Read! Explore the Night!" The New Hampshire Trustee Association Conference proved to be beneficial not only to me but to the trustees and Library Foundation members.
