#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Building Committee Update: The Building Committee interviewed several construction managers and will make a recommendation to the Select Board for the approval of their candidate at the Oct. 14 the BOS meeting. If approved by the Select Board, the manager will attend the Oct 17 Building Committee Meeting.

NH Municipal Bond Bank: The trustees will ask Sheila St. Germain, executive director of the NHMBB, to attend the Dec.9 Select Board Meeting to provide information on the bond process and to answer any questions. The trustees will also contact Julie to schedule a public hearing for the bond.

Public Relations: Sharon asked the art teacher at Mastway School if she would involve students in the creation of a new logo for the LPLCC. The trustees hope this will make parents and students more aware of the building project.

Recreational Committee: The trustees met with the Recreation Committee and gave their suggestions for a recreational partnership between the library and the recreation committee. Sharon will offer a program on stargazing with the library's telescope at Little River Park.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

FY 2014-2015 Budget: The trustees approved the budget as revised. The circulation librarian's hours will increase by two hours. The library will be open one additional hour starting on July 14, 2014. (Probably Thurs. evening). A new position (Assistant Librarian II) was created to reflect the increased tasks and responsibilities that are not applicable to the current page position. On Oct. 17 the trustees will present their budget to the Advisory Budget Committee and the Select Board.

Work Session: The trustees will hold a work session on Nov. 5 to strategize ways to inform the public about the bond and the building.

### OTHER:

The Friends of the Lee Library will hold a Holiday Farm Tour and Concert on Dec. 8.
