REGULAR MEETING OF THE LITCHFIELD BOARD OF SELECTMEN TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2015 TOWN OFFICE BUILDING ~ 5:30 P.M.

<u>Call to Order</u>: First Selectman Leo Paul, Jr. called the meeting to order at 5:32p.m. Selectmen present were Diane Knox, Jonathan Torrant and Paul Parsons. Jeffrey Zullo was absent.

Approval of Minutes

a) Regular October 6, 2015: Motion: J. Torrant moved to approve the minutes of the October 6, 2015 regular meeting with one correction under Approval of Minutes, b) to read that L. Paul seconded the motion to approve the special meeting minutes of September 24, 2015. D. Knox seconded the motion. Upon voting, L. Paul, D. Knox, and J. Torrant voted aye with P. Parsons abstaining because of absence. The motion carried, as a majority of the members who attended the meeting were present to vote.

<u>Public Requests/Comments:</u> Peter Litwin, Litchfield Land Trust, thanked the board for going out to Donahue Road Property recently and stated that he would like to work out an agreement with the town on this matter. D. Knox said she went on the walk and thought it was highly informative. The property has a much diversified topography. She would like to see all parties work together to come to an agreement. P. Parsons agreed and said he would like to see something worked out and not to sell the property as it now is. Mr. Litwin will contact Mr. Edelman, the adjacent property owner, and L. Paul will speak with Attorney Michael Rybak.

Selectmen's Requests: L. Paul noted that Jack Healy, Public Works Director, is no longer employed by the Town. His last day was last Friday, Oct. 16th. There are nine applicants for the position and the interview committee hopes to begin interviews soon and will report back to the Board at the next meeting. There are other options that the Board may wish to consider for the position. Mr. Paul stated that he attended the CCM Conference today, with legislative committees together and having an opportunity to be prepared for the upcoming legislative session. L. Paul stated that he received the Clean Energy Community Program award for Litchfield's silver level achievement from Eversource. D. Knox reiterated she would like to explore with Town Counsel and the Litchfield Land Trust the possibility of an arrangement for Donahue Road, and P. Parsons agreed.

New Business

a) Use of Town Seal on CT Food Bank Distribution Facility Display: Mr. Paul explained that the CT Food Bank is building a big distribution center and would like a copy of our Town Seal to display in their foyer. He was uneasy about this as it could be opening Pandora's box and he's already denied CCM's request for the seal. He asked for the Town Attorney's advice who said in the absence of an ordinance, he referred to CT General Statute § 7-101. The Board of Selectmen governs the seal and the Town Clerk is the custodian. Mr. Paul said he has a request in writing and left the decision to the Board. Motion: J. Torrant moved to table this until the next meeting with paperwork provided. L Paul said they are looking for a prompt response. P. Parsons seconded the motion. J. Torrant and P. Parsons voted aye, and L. Paul and D. Knox voted nay; motion failed. Motion: D. Knox then moved to deny the Town Seal on the

CT Food Bank distribution center display, and L. Paul seconded. Upon voting all voted aye and the motion carried. P. Parsons asked Mr. Paul to send a letter explaining the reasons for denial.

- b) Award Bid for Electronic Sign on Constitution Way: Mr. Paul said the insurance for the accident that damaged the sign will offset some of the funding in Capital earmarked for a new electronic sign. Mr. Paul said they are being asked to approve the expenditure. Motion: P. Parsons moved to approve the contract award to low bidder Lauretano Sign Group in the amount of \$20,990, contingent upon first securing all approvals. J. Torrant seconded, all voted aye and the motion carried.
- c) Award Bid for Cathole Road Drainage: Motion: J. Torrant moved to award the Cathole Road Drainage and Road Improvements contract to low bidder Deacon Excavating, LLC in the amount of \$58,890. D. Knox seconded. J. Torrant asked Mr. Fasano, Facilities Manager, to indicate in the future where the money is coming from. Upon voting, all voted aye and the motion carried.
- d) Award Bid for Ten-Wheel Dump Truck: Motion: D. Knox moved to award the Landscape Dump Truck bid to sole and low bidder Marola Motor Sales in the amount of \$103,300. J. Torrant seconded and added that this recommendation shows where the money is coming from and that funding is adequate. This bid is for a truck and chassis, and more equipment will need to be added, but Mr. Fasano assured the Board the funds are in place. Upon voting, all voted aye and the motion carried.
- e) Award Bid for 4WD 3/4-Ton Pickup Truck: Motion: J. Torrant moved to table Item e) until further information and recommendation is obtained. P. Parsons seconded the motion. This truck is for the WPCA, and approvals must first go through that board. Upon voting all voted aye and the motion carried.
