The program will provide an overview of the different types, the origins of, and the benefits of tea. It will include a tea sampling. The Friends of the Londonderry Leach Library will be sponsoring the program.

Announcements -

- Once I receive notification that the auditors are done and I receive the final FY07/08 report, I will complete the annual report for FY07/08 per RSA 202-A:12.
- On September 4, 2008, the library began to offer WiFi access to the community.
- On September 15, 2008, the library experienced a leaking pipe above the reference area. The brass cap and gasket were replaced which stopped the leak. There was no property damage.
- The library's budget presentation is scheduled for November 6, 2008.

Assistant Director and Head of Reference Services Report:

- There were 1124 items cataloged this month and 675 items discarded.
- The reference staff answered 888 reference questions this month and logged 1017 people onto the Internet. This is a 24% increase from just last month.
- WiFi has gone very smoothly. There are many people using their own laptops in addition to the number of logins above. It has been enthusiastically received.
- Kendall attended the unveiling of the New Hampshire Humanities Council 2008-2010 catalog of performers. She was able to preview programs that might be of interest to our community.
- We have all sorts of books on hobbies displayed on the large table. Whether you enjoy beekeeping, stamp collecting, or scuba diving, we have a book for you.
- The small display table features books by New Hampshire authors. Our beautiful New England setting has inspired poets and novelists such as John Irving, Jodi Picoult, Dan Brown, Robert Frost or Donald Hall.

Assistant Director and Head of Circulation Services Report:

- During the month of September circulation increased almost 28% over September 2007. The Adult Room circulated 14,645 items and the Children's Room circulated 10,073 items.
- The Children's Room staff answered 424 Reference questions during September.
- The final numbers have been tallied for the Children's Summer Reading Program, 2008. A total of 1,011 children signed up and read 20,420 books. This was more than enough to get us to Australia and back. Congratulations to everyone who participated and made this possible.
- During September all children visiting the library could guess the number of mini pumpkins in a jar. The closest guess won a large pumpkin, kindly donated by Mack's Apples. There were a total of 765 guesses, and the lucky winner has been notified.
- We are pleased to announce that we had a total of 189 new patrons sign up for library cards during Library Card Sign-Up Month, to help us try to meet the Robert Finlay Challenge. The lucky raffle winner has been drawn and will be notified shortly.
- Last month Tricia Hamann and her dog Nilla visited the library. Nilla is a therapy dog, registered with Therapy Dogs International, whose job is to listen to a child read to her. The children who made appointments with Nilla really enjoyed the experience. Our thanks to Tricia Hamann for volunteering her time and Nilla's attention, and for coming again in October to work with more children. Any child, grades 1 through 6, who would like to read to Nilla on Wednesday, October 15 between 3:30 and 4:30 p.m., may pre-register for a fifteen minute slot, on Monday, October 6, until the program is full.
- Also on Wednesday, October 15, from 5:45 to 6:45 p.m., there will be a Young Adult book discussion during Teen Read Week on *Lyddie* by Katherine Paterson. I was able to borrow multiple copies of the book from the New Hampshire State Library. Any teen, grades 6 through 12 who wish to take part, may pick up a copy of the book from the main desk. Snacks and a door prize will be provided.
- Teen Read Week runs from October 13 through October 18, 2008. Any teens visiting the library during this week may pick up a short quiz at the front desk. Hand in the completed quiz for a small prize and a raffle ticket.

• Fixed price contract for natural gas-

Barbara Ostertag-Holtkamp stated that in the past, when the issue was raised, she was told that as there was only one supplier, so there wouldn't be any incentive for the company to offer a lower rate.
