#### Programs -

- On Thursday, October 14, 2010, the library hosted "Haunted Lighthouses of New England". 73 individuals attended the program.
- On Thursday, November 18, 2010, at 7:00 p.m., the library will have a concert with Jazz Guitarist Gerry Johnston. This solo jazz guitar performance will include selections from "The American Songbook." These standards include songs by composers such as George Gershwin, Duke Ellington, and Cole Porter.
- On Thursday, January 13, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will offer the program "Seasons of the White Mountains" with Dave Smith. Take a visual journey along trails, brooks, and beautiful vistas of the White Mountains through each season as hiker and professional photographer Dave Smith presents this stunning slideshow program. Mr. Smith will also discuss the history of the region and its scenic landmarks.
- On Thursday, February 10, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will host "Ahoy, Pirates!" with John Horrigan. New England folklorist John Horrigan presents this fascinating, illustrated program on privateers and pirates. Mr. Horrigan will discuss the history of piracy, from its Golden Age through the contemporary pirates who lurk off the coast of Somalia today. His topics will include the Pirate Code, pirate myths, buried treasure, and a number of notorious pirates, including Captain Kidd, Calico Jack, and Black Beard.
- On Thursday, March 10, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library presents the Random Acts of Harmony Concert. A musical trio comprised of members Rob Becker, Dick Kruppa, and Peter Aucoin perform familiar folk tunes in three-part harmony with acoustic guitar, five-string banjo, and stand-up bass accompaniment. Over the years, they have played and sung in groups that opened for the Beach Boys, The Lettermen, and Pete Seeger. Spend an evening listening to traditional and contemporary folk tunes and learning the stories and histories of the songs and songwriters.
- On Thursday, April 14, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will hold the program "The Old Man of the Mountain: Substance and Symbol" with Maggie Stier. This illustrated talk will explore the story of the Old Man of the Mountain and its importance to the history of New Hampshire. Ms. Stier will discuss the different and evolving ways that the Old Man affected our history, arts, literature, philosophy and even public policy over its 200-year history. The presentation will include images of paintings, literary passages, souvenirs, film clips of interviews with those closest to the Old Man, and a discussion of the current efforts to memorialize the state symbol.
- On Thursday, May 12, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will offer "Painting Myths and Legends" with Dr. Andrew Laurie Stangel. This illustrated lecture will examine the classical traditions of ancient Greece and Rome that have influenced

the art of the Western World. Dr. Stangel will discuss how these traditions have been narrated in paint by some of the world's greatest artists from the Renaissance and Baroque through modern times while showing examples of arthistorical slides photographed in museums and galleries throughout Europe and the United States.

### Announcements -

- The library has recently experienced some thefts of current issues of magazines. We have moved the current issues behind the circulation desk for check out.
- The library's budget will be presented on Saturday, November 20, 2010. The meeting starts at 8:00 a.m. The library is the second to the last department on the schedule.

# Assistant Director and Head of Circulation Services Report:

- During the month of October, the adult room circulated a total of 15,844 materials and the children's room circulated 9,920 materials. This was a 2.45% decrease in overall circulation over October 2009; however there was a 4% overall increase in circulation from November 2008 through October of 2009 to November 2009 through October of 2010.
- On Monday, November 22, from 4:00 5:00 p.m., the children's room is pleased to welcome Pig from Laura Numeroff's *If You Give a Pig a Party* and *If You Give a Pig a Pancake* books. The program is limited to 90 people. Advance registration is required and starts on Monday, November 15 at 9:00 a.m. Contact the children's room for further details.
- This month's display in the children's room is Party Time. Books about all kinds of parties and party planning for children can be found on the display just inside the children's room door.

# Assistant Director and Head of Reference Services Report:

- The reference staff answered 830 reference questions in October and answered 72 directional questions. We logged 867 patrons onto the Internet. This was a 7.4% decrease for all reference transactions from last October; however there was a 7.05% increase in reference transactions from November through October of 2009 to November through October of this year.
- If you would like to be an author one of the best tips is to write, write, write. The library can also help by providing some great resources for writers which are on display on the large table. Celebrate "National Novel Writing Month" and "I Love to Write Day" on November 15<sup>th</sup> by taking pen to paper.
- Our small table features all things Star Wars. We have nonfiction books on the great Star Ships, the Star War movies, original fiction books, as well as many spin offs for you to enjoy.
