Director's Report:

Gifts Donated to the Leach Library –

- Mr. Albert Brenner donated \$300.00 to the library.
- Ms. Doris Labbe donated \$25.00 to the library.
- An anonymous donor donated a small wood hanging from Russia to the library.

Programs -

- On Thursday, April 14, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library had the program "The Old Man of the Mountain: Substance and Symbol" with Maggie Stier. 54 individuals attended the program.
- On Thursday, May 12, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will offer "Painting Myths and Legends" with Dr. Andrew Laurie Stangel. This illustrated lecture will examine the classical traditions of ancient Greece and Rome that have influenced the art of the Western World. Dr. Stangel will discuss how these traditions have been narrated in paint by some of the world's greatest artists from the Renaissance and Baroque through modern times while showing examples of arthistorical slides photographed in museums and galleries throughout Europe and the United States.
- On Thursday, September 15, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will have the program "Susan B. Anthony The Invincible!" with Sally Matson. In this program, Susan B. Anthony is brought to life by performer Sally Matson. The play uses letters, speeches and diaries to highlight Miss Anthony's interactions with such notables as Frederick Douglass, Harriet Tubman, Horace Greeley, and Elizabeth Cady Stanton. The program is being co-sponsored with the Londonderry Historical Society.
- On Thursday, October 13, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library will have the program "Silent Movie Performance with Richard Hughes". In this program, silent movie pianist Richard Hughes will provide a glimpse into cinematic history as he discusses the silent film industry and performs several sample musical pieces of the day. He will then present several short comedy films with their musical accompaniment, including a Buster Keaton film, a Charlie Chaplin Film, as well as the Laurel and Hardy comedy *Habeas Corpus*.
- On Thursday, November 10, 2011, at 7:00 p.m., the library presents Rob Velella as Nathaniel Hawthorne. In this program, actor Rob Velella portrays author Nathaniel Hawthorne. As Hawthorne, he will briefly introduce himself and then read from several of his well-known short stories, such as "The Minister's Black Veil" and "The Birth-Mark."

Announcements -

- On April 13, 2011, I met with a representative from Virtual Town Hall to discuss the library's webpages on the Town's new website. The new website will tentatively be launched in May, so all information, links, etc. will need to be evaluated to determine what will end up on the new site. Barbara Ostertag-Holtkamp informed the Board that the Trustee Minutes for 2008 to the present will be on the new web site. She asked if this was sufficient or if some minutes from 2007 should be added. The Board said 2008 to the present will be sufficient.

Assistant Director and Head of Circulation Services Report:

- During the month of April, the total number of adult and children's materials circulated was 26,757, a 4.24% increase over April 2010.
- Jennifer DelVillar, the Senior Children's Librarian, has received a donated \$25.00 gift certificate from Whippersnappers for the children's summer reading program.
- In April, we had an interesting visit of Unusual Animals from Critters 'N' Creatures. A total of 90 participants came to learn about animals that look a little bit different than you would expect.
- In May, the children's room has a wide range of programs and activities planned for the month.
 - O During Children's Book Week, May 2-7, the children's room will be holding a raffle for a chance to win a book bag. Children may earn raffle tickets by checking out and reading books from the children's room.
