Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chair Betsy McKinney. The following board members were in attendance: Melissa Coffey, John Curran, Sandy Geisler, Carol Introne, Cynthia Peterson, and Vicki Stachowske. Also in attendance: Barbara Ostertag-Holtkamp, Library Director; and Sally Nelson, Assistant Director and Head of Circulation Services.

Secretary's Report:

The Secretary's Report for May 1, 2019 was distributed prior to the meeting. No changes were made. A **motion** was made by Melissa Coffey to accept the minutes as written. The **motion was seconded** by John Curran. All in attendance accepted the motion, **motion carried**.

Director's Report:

Gifts Donated to the Leach Library -

- The library has received the following gift cards for the adult summer reading program:

<u>Programs –</u>

- On Thursday, May 16, the library hosted Ms. Ellie Roden for an evening presentation of "Art from the Garden: Creating with Pressed Flowers". This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Londonderry Leach Library. 21 individuals attended the program.
- On Thursday, June 13, at 7:00 p.m., the library will offer Ms. Marya Danihel's musical presentation "Pleasures of the Parlor: Playlists from a Victorian iPod". Ms. Danihel will introduce a variety of tunes middle-class New England families loved to sing during the Victorian era. She will combine her performances with some music history discussion.

Announcements -

• On January 23, 2019, an elbow joint of a pipe going to the sprinkler in the alcove next to my office broke. It caused major flooding in approximately 1/3 of the adult section of the library. Thousands of dollars of items were saved by the staff including original artwork, chairs, tables and materials. The carpet was extracted that evening, and was cleaned and treated for mold the next day. So, the carpet was also saved. Unfortunately, there was

damage to some drum tables and books that would need to be replaced. Also, the alcove walls and ceiling would need to be demolished and rebuilt. The same applied to the sheet rock and coving up along the walls from the circulation desk to the study room. In this case, the repairs of the walls would only encompass the bottom two feet. The repair started on Wednesday, January 30. The repairs were completed on Friday, March 1, 2019. Invoices totaling \$104,512.61 have been submitted to the insurance company. These include an estimated cost for the replacement of three drum tables with shipping. Two checks have been issued to date: one in the amount of \$3,296.22 which has been posted to the library's budget. A second check was issued to Insurcomm for \$37,177.31. The \$1,000 deductible came from the Town's insurance deductible line. There is one outstanding invoice to Insurcomm for \$63,039.08. I heard today from the insurance adjustor and the claims consultant that the claim is finalized.

- The area near the front entrance of the library has rotted wood that will need to be replaced and painted. The project has been tentatively scheduled to start sometime this month.
- Registration for our adult, young adult and children's summer reading programs began last Saturday and there is already a total of over 260 sign-ups for the three programs.
- One of our part-time Library Technicians resigned recently to accept a full-time postion in another library.

Assistant Director and Head of Circulation Services Report:

- The subject of the Spotlight Display in the Children's Room, that each month highlights books from different areas of the collection, is *A Universe of Stories*, the theme of this year's Children's Summer Reading Program. Stop by and check out the displays and some of our materials on space travel, aliens and distant planets.

- Come to the library on Monday, June 3 from 4:00-5:00 p.m. for a craft program where participants will paint their own fish scene. This program is open to 90 participants.
