**ALAC proposals (60)**

- Paul gave an overall talk regarding his presentation to the Town Council. He passed out a copy of the format and discussion points. Items that were discussed included:
  - **BL 2011**
    1. There was a general increase in the participation level both for groups and volunteers.
    2. All six schools were involved and ten Town owned sites were worked on
    3. There was a suggestion that the groups sign waiver forms when they propose to work along roadways.
    4. Police still have the final say on the safety along each road.
    5. The use of cones and signs is necessary.
    6. There was discussion about spreading some of the organization of BL to each group coordinator. There was discussion about identifying a group coordinator at each school next year to help organize projects in the school district.
  - **Londonderry Welcome Signs**
    1. There are two new landscapers for the signs. New signs recognizing these new companies will be added to the existing smaller signs. The two new landscapers are Independence Lawn and Blackburn Outdoor Services.
- ALAC Update – Five members of the ALAC were present to discuss what they have been working on and some proposals they wanted the SWAC to consider.

- They made a power point presentation similar to what they will be showing the Town Council.
  - They have obtained a letter from the Police Chief stating that the Police Department is behind their efforts.
  - They will install four signs at select locations where they can monitor their effectiveness. Those locations are Gilcreast and Adams Roads.
  - They have developed their plan for moving forward but will need some financial assistance. They would like to solicit help from town businesses.
  - Paul and the SWAC members gave the ALAC some suggestions for changes to their presentation
  - The SWAC approved their plans for the neighborhood anti-litter signs and gave them the green light to present their plans to the Town Council.
  - The SWAC also proposed that ALAC have Town Council write a letter requesting the business community to get behind the anti-litter effort.
- Acceptance of Minutes:
