The Londonderry Street Naming system Task Force held a public workshop on April 6, 2010 in the Community Room of the Londonderry Police Department. The meeting began at 7:00 P.M.

Meeting opened at 7:00 P.M.

Jim Bilodeau advises of 911 street naming guidelines, the Swanzey court decision and explains why the task force was formed by the Town Council.

John Vogl and Karen Marchant give the residents copies of the 911 street naming guidelines, a summary of the Swanzey decision and copies of a frequently asked questions packet.

It was explained to the residents of Anderson Circle that a meeting had previously been held with the residents of Anderson Lane. The residents of Anderson Lane had presented much documentation about the historical significance of Anderson Lane. This meeting was being held so that the residents of Anderson Circle could provide their input to the Task Force.

Residents asked if it was necessary to change the information at the registry of deed or on their mortgages, Karen Marchant advised that there was no need for residents to notify the registry of deeds and that the information changes for mortgages could be done at time of sale.

Another resident asked who would be responsible for fees incurred as a result of any name change. He stated that he held licenses in another state which were associated with his business. He stated that he would be charged a fee if he needed to change the information on those licenses. Jim Bilodeau advised that there was no money from 911 or the State to cover any fees. Karen Marchant advised the resident that those types of fees would be his responsibility.

Cindy McCann explained that there were no changes necessary for passports and that included in the official notice of change would be a form to send to the state for residents to comply with State Law to Notify the State of any address change for driver's licenses and motor vehicle registrations. No fee is needed for these changes.

Residents were further advised that the post office would forward any mail addressed to old addresses to the new address for 1 year. There is no fee for this.

Alexander Hahnl of 1 Anderson Lane submitted copies of a letter he had circulated to neighbors on Anderson Lane asking them to support a name change of Horseshoe Way or Horseshoe Lane.

Valerie Cameron of 15 Anderson Circle submitted a list of 5 alternate names

Cindy Grigas of 22 Anderson Circle submitted a list of 5 additional alternate names and her thoughts, comments and objections to the change.

Keith Uva of 4 Anderson Circle objected to changing the name of Anderson Circle at all, stating that this was a "Live Free or Die State". He said he would stop any change from happening.

Grace Pelletier of 20 Anderson Circle suggested the name of "Goss". She stated that it was a name that she had seen on a lot of headstones in a nearby cemetery and appeared to have a lot of historical significance.

John Vogl explained the process to the residents in attendance. He told them that the Task Force would consider their comments and make a recommendation to the Town Council. He further advised that residents that they would be notified of the date of the Town Council Meeting.

Karen Marchant advised that the meeting would probably not be before mid May.

Motion by Jim Bilodeau to adjourn, seconded by John Vogl. Motion passed unanimously (4-0).

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 P.M.

Reid Circle-

Gen. George Reid settled in Londonderry in 1719, in 1785 he was a Brigadier General of NH forces

If you will not be able to attend the meeting and agree with the Horseshoe Way name change, please sign below.


