Peter Curro, 105 Adams Road, the Chairman of HealthTrust and Peter Bragdon, Exeutive Direction of HealthTrusy. Curro turned the presentation over to Bragdon. Bragdon went over the membership agreement. Bragdon stated that if there are any questions he would be happy to take them. Town Manager Smith stated that his intention is not to have to Council vote on signing them but it was rather to just bring in HealthTrust to answer any questions the Council may have.			
25 26 27 28	Councilor Dolan asked what steps HealthTrust has taken to protect membership and peoples personal information from hacks. Bragdon stated that they are subject to all the HIPO requirements to keep data safe. They have been through two complete audits of the IT security.

Chairman Farrell stated that no decisions will be made this evening with regard to Ordinances. Chief Hart introduced himself and stated that he was assigned on January 5 <sup>th</sup> by the Town Council to Chair a group of citizens to look into the issue of target shooting in the Musquash. The nine citizens that were chosen by the Town Council and Town Manager donated their time. Chief Hart thanked those citizens who donated their time to this task force. The goal of the report is to relate the facts to the Council. The task force met a total of seven times beginning in January and concluded in April. A public session was held on March 25 <sup>th</sup> . There were a total of nine recommendations made. They ranged from setting specific places for target shooting to limiting target shooting until a place is designate, and everything in the middle.			

Councilor Freda asked what the consensus of the group was. Chief Hart stated that there was no

42 43	consensus but a total of nine recommendations in order to assist the Council. Chief Hart went through the recommendations. Chief Hart stated that each one is different and each one offers different solutions.			
44 45 46 47	Town Council discussed the funding it would take. Chairman Farrell stated that from what he hears, people prefer it to stop.

Considine stated that he has some information of incidents that have happened and that people are no longer calling the police department. Considine stated that something needs to be done. Councilor Green stated that he knows people who do not call the Police Department anymore. It's hard for people to report it without evidence. Chairman Farrell stated that people need to start calling. Considine stated that he has run across groups shooting in the Musquash recently, most people from out of town. A lot of surrounding towns are banning target shooting.			
56 57 58 59	Al Baldasaro, 41 Hall Rd, stated that he has dealt with this issue in the House. Baldasaro stated that New Hampshire is one of the safest States in the Country. Baldasaro stated that people should be taking videos and pictures when they see reckless shooting.

The Council agreed. Anything done on Town land would need to be approved by the Council and funding would have to go to the voters. What the Council is looking for is further information for producing a proper Ordinance, correctly. The Council needs to get more answers before an Ordinance is written.
