At the end of the January 21, 2015 meeting the Zoning Administrator made the following comments to the Board:

RICHARD CANUEL: Before we adjourn, I just want to make a comment to the Board, so when you're ready?

JIM SMITH: Go ahead.

RICHARD CANUEL: It's more of a point of order having to do with the Casey case the appeal for administrative decision, and having to do with the recusal of a Board member. I know it's been customary that you know a member automatically disqualifies him or herself and then steps from the Board claiming that they have a possible conflict of interest in hearing the case. By statute that member if you feel you have a conflict of interest is to bring that to the Board's attention, and the Board votes whether the details of that warrants the member stepping down or not. By that statute basically it says the member has a direct personal or pecuniary interest in the case and I'll just read a quote from that, it says "reasons for disqualification do not include exemption from service as a juror, or knowledge of the facts involved gained in the performance of a members official duties", so especially in Jim's particular case because Jim you served as the Building Official at the time, some of this stuff was going on, that isn't necessarily grounds for recusing yourself from the Board, so that we don't end up in a situation where we have a non-quorum of Board members, so [Overlapping Comments]. That's, that's something to consider. Yeah, the Board should vote on that. If the Board feels that like I said the details of the conflict warrant that member to set down then allow the member to step down, but it's a Board decision.

ANNETTE STOLLER: And therefore being the/a neighbor on the block is not adequate. RICHARD CANUEL: Not necessarily, no. Well, if we want to talk particular Mr. Bernadino's case because he is a complainant [Overlapping Comments]. He step down, ves. BILL BERNADINO: I was just told that I was sending harassing texts; I don't even know what that meant. RICHARD CANUEL: If you want to read that statute it's 673:14. NEIL DUNN: No, and I've read that before and I don't think too often as the Board we never vote we just let the person step down, and we usually continue the case, but this one is getting crazy at this point [Overlapping Comments], so I agree with you and I'm not sure if...but whatever. JIM SMITH: I hear what you're saying Richard. RICHARD CANUEL: Yeah, yeah. JIM SMITH: But... RICHARD CANUEL: Like I say, you as the member you may say I think I have a conflict of interest here, but it's up to the Board to decide whether that's you know going to put you guys in hot water, or if someone's going to appeal your decision.
