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Marge Badois called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. She appointed M Speltz to vote for M Byerly

Old Business

Kendall Pond: M Badois informed the Commission that Lisa Drabik, Assistant Town Manager, had forwarded her an email from Steve Cotton, Administrative Support Coordinator, that was approved by Janusz Czyzowski, Director of Public Works and Engineering, after he made a site visit to Kendall Pond. She read from the email: "essentially the only change is to leave the granite posts and add some black chains between them, such that the parking area would be expanded as we have been discussing, but the only way to enter the new cleared area will be through the existing driveway. Alternatively, instead of all this clearing, we could of course go back to the simple stationary gate idea, replace the logs, but of course this offers less parking in theory than what was planned." G Harrington stated that they would put chains between the posts and clear trees from the posts back. M Badois stated she wanted to read what Steve Cotton wrote to her: "we are in agreement to clear the area, approximately 35 X 65, but leave the existing granite posts and the grass that exists there today next to the road. The existing granite posts have bolts to connect black chains between them to make potential access to Kendall Pond. We could also place rocks between the granite posts as another precaution to prevent access. As stated previously, we will place additional logs like we have today in the new expansion area. All access to the existing expansion would be through the existing entrance." D Lievens asked if there was anyone in the Department of Public Works (DPW) that could make a drawing of the proposed plan. M Noone stated that he could draw a diagram for the Commission tonight of what the proposed new plan was. A Kizak put up a map on the board for the Commission and M Noone drew a diagram of the new proposed plan. M Badois stated that part of the plan is for the Commission to authorize a \$2,500 expense for the project. D Lievens stated in her opinion, she thought this was a good idea. M Noone stated he thought it was a good idea because the neighbors will be happy, as they have had an issue here for about 9 years. B Maxwell went on the record noting that the price is reasonable, but he has a problem fixing a crime problem in town, and would propose that this project not set a precedent. D Lievens stated she agreed with him one hundred percent. M Badois noted that the plans have changed slightly and was not sure if the pricing had changed as well. M Speltz stated that he would take a slightly different slant than B Maxwell, as if this was strictly a drug problem, the police department would enforce the law, but if there



37 are physical changes to be made to a property, than he thought it could involve the Department of 38 Public Works, as well as the police. B Maxwell agreed with M Speltz stating that it is a town problem. R 39 Fillio stated he agreed with both B Maxwell and M Speltz, noting that the Commission wanted to put in 40 parking, and he thinks the Commission will receive better parking with this deal. M Badois added that 41 with more visible parking, it might encourage more people to use Kendall Pond. She also noted that the 42 Commission's consensus would be to not set a precedent for the Commission to be responsible for 43 funding crime prevention. G Harrington made a motion that the Commission authorize up to \$2,500 out 44 of the Conservation Fund for the Kendall Pond improvement project noting that the Commission is not 45 setting a precedent for being responsible for funding crime prevention. R Fillio seconded the motion. 46 The motion passed, 7-0-0.

Land acquisition process: M Badois asked if M Speltz sent the draft by email. M Speltz stated that he had again, but seeing how no one received it, he would send it to M Badois' private email to ensure that it is received.

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Water resource management: A Kizak explained that she had a meeting with Colleen Mailloux, Town Planner, Kevin Smith, Town Manager and Steve Cotton, and found out that the warrant article for \$35,000 is for a different water and air quality study. M Badois asked if A Kizak knew what the cost would be for a water resource management study. M Speltz stated that he had been working with the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC) who thought they could do it for \$35,000; however, that relied on a lot of work from A Kizak. He asked if A Kizak could estimate what she thought her contribution might be towards this, and asked the Commission to consider funding a water resource study with conservation funds, assuming it is consistent with the law. M Badois asked who is performing the water and air quality study. A Kizak stated it was EnSafe Inc. who worked on the 2001 and 2004 studies. M Speltz asked if this is a sole source contract. A Kizak stated that she is not sure as Steven Cotton is managing it. M Noone asked what the specific study is doing. A Kizak stated it is testing water quality in wells in town. M Speltz stated there are 12 sampling locations and an air quality station at Moose Hill. He asked the Commission if they would be in favor of spending up to \$70,000 for such a study out of the Open Space fund. The Commission's consensus was positive for such a study. M Speltz stated he would email Kevin Smith and request a legal review. He asked for A Kizak to reach out and let Sylvia von Aulock, Executive Director for the SNHPC, know what direction the Commission is taking.

Encroachments: M Noone explained that they are waiting until the end of the month for any further action with the Gilcreast encroachment. He stated that the Cooper parcel was addressed by the police department before and they have continued to disturb the soil. He explained that he and M Speltz went out over the weekend to reestablish the boundaries and found another encroachment. He stated they were attempting to place conservation signs to mark the boundary, but encountered an upset resident, who was adamant that M Noone and M Speltz were on his property, so they stopped putting up the



signs. He noted that he contacted Richard Canuel, Chief Building Inspector, Health Officer, Zoning 72 73 Administrator & Code Enforcement Officer, and the police department about the upset resident. He 74 stated that the next time the police would escort him to the property to not escalate the upset resident. 75 M Badois asked if M Noone wanted to hire a surveyor again. M Speltz made a motion to expend an 76 amount not to exceed \$5,000 from the Open Space fund, for a surveyor to establish a boundary line 77 along the northeast corner of the Cooper parcel where it parallels Iroquois Circle. G Harrington 78 seconded the motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0. 79 Turtle signs: M Badois informed the Commission that the signs arrived today and asked specifically 80 where the signs are needed. G Harrington stated he thought Fish & Game wanted signs on Wiley Hill 81 Road. M Noone suggested that Melissa Doperalski, from Fish & Game should tell the Commission where 82 to place them and stated that he would email her. M Badois suggested that she draw the Commission a 83 map as well. 84 Public walk/paddle: M Badois informed the Commission that the paddle would be this Saturday, July 85 14, 2018, at Scobie Pond from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. She asked if anyone else had kayaks that they could 86 bring. R Floyd stated that he has 2 kayaks and can drop them off, as he cannot make it. 87 Cross Farm: A Kizak informed the Commission that an email was sent out to Cross Farm to put the 88 conservation signs up and she will be following up to make sure the signs are placed. 89 **New Business:** 90 CIP: M Badois asked if the Commission needed anything. M Speltz stated it was a \$100,000 minimum 91 threshold, and therefore the water study would not qualify. 92 Camera: B Maxwell stated he did not think the camera would be viable with the change in parking at 93 Kendall Pond. M Badois asked if the camera could pick up the number of cars. B Maxwell stated he 94 thought it could do that. G Harrington thought it would be good to count the road traffic or the number 95 of people using Kendall Pond with the camera. M Badois agreed that it would be a good statistic to have. 96 Minutes: The Commissioners went over the public minutes from June 26, 2018. G Harrington made a 97 motion to accept the minutes as amended. B Maxwell seconded the motion. The motion passed, 5-0-2 98 with M Noone and R Fillio abstaining. 99 **Mesiti Development orchard:** M Speltz informed the Commission that he found out the owner applying 100 for the assessment cannot be the cause of the contamination, which makes him believe that it might be 101 okay for Mesiti to apply for the assessment. He stated that he needs to call and speak with someone

regarding this and if they can indeed apply, he can fill out the application for them.

104	Reeds Ferry Site Plan (Map 2 Lots 34, 34-4, & 34-5): The Commissioners reviewed the DRC for Reeds
105	Ferry Site plan commenting that it looks like the pavement proposed on the northerly side of building
106	Map 2 Lot 34-4, is less than 15 feet from the lot boundary, which is a requirement of Londonderry's site
107	plan regulations. The Commissioners suggested using pervious pavement given the high percentage of
108	impervious pavement on this site.
109	Adjournment: M Speltz made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:45 p.m. G Harrington seconded the
110	motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0.
