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- Marge Badois called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. She appointed R Floyd to vote for M Noone and J
- 11 Christenson-Collins to vote for R Fillio until he arrived.
- 12 Jeff Merritt, Engineer with Keach-Nordstrom Associates, Mike Ross, Liberty, and Luke Hurley, Liberty
- 13 Utilities & Pennichuck Water Works dredge and fill: J Merritt presented the Commission with the gas
- 14 and water line extension. He passed out packets for the Commission to review while he presented. He
- 15 stated that the gas extension would start at Buttrick Road/Route 102 intersection and extend southwest
- to Cross Farm development site. He noted that the water extension would start at Young Road and got
- to the Cross Farm development. He stated that all of the proposed work to be done is in the Route 102
- 18 New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) right-of-way. He informed the Commission that
- 19 there are a number or temporary wetland impacts, totaling 16, 400 SF. He stated that all the companies
- 20 are trying to minimize wetland impacts as much as possible for the project. J Merritt stated that the
- 21 dredge and fill application had been submitted to the state. He concluded his presentation. D Lievens
- 22 made a motion that the Commission recommend the dredge and fill application. M Byerly seconded the
- 23 motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0.

24 Old Business

- 25 Musquash Field Day February 17, 2018: M Badois informed the Commission that she thought the
- 26 snowshoes would be a waste of time, as the conditions are very messy and slushy with not much snow
- 27 left. D Ellis stated that most of the Musquash was ice when he was last out there. J Christenson-Collins
- 28 stated she would be emailing R Fillio with the shopping list. M Badois stated that she had the 2-gallon
- thermos for coffee and 2 pump jugs for cider. D Lievens mentioned that Andy Mack will be having an
- 30 apple pie contest that morning at 10 a.m. M Badois stated she put up the sign for the field day on High
- 31 Range Road. R Floyd commented that he had a utility cart with wheels that might be easier than using a
- 32 sled. M Badois stated that she would pick up the first aid kit and asked if the letter from Kevin Smith,
- 33 Town Manager, had been received for the fire permit. The Commissioners agreed that they should
- arrive at 9:30 a.m. to set up for the event.



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Kendall Pond: M Badois informed the Commission that the gate would have a timer, which could be controlled by a cell phone, have an electric eye, and will require Eversource to put in a pole for electricity. She stated that the grand total would be just under \$21,000. B Maxwell asked if the Town or Conservation Commission would be paying for this. M Badois stated it would be the Conservation Commission. M Badois asked if there should be insurance on the surveillance equipment in case of vandalism. D Lievens made a motion that the Commission go ahead with the gate at Kendall Pond with the budget not to exceed \$21,000, including the surveillance camera. G Harrington seconded the motion. M Byerly stated for the record, he thought the Town should be paying for this, not the Conservation Commission, as he does not want to put a gate in there and make it harder for people to use Kendall Pond. He stated the gate is to prevent people from committing crime, which he does not think is a charter of the Conservation Commission. D Lievens asked if M Badois had asked the Town to pay for it. M Badois stated that she had not. M Byerly commented that the gate was not part of the Kendall Pond improvement plan that the Commission had created and stated M Badois should ask the Town to pay for it. D Lievens struck her first motion. She asked who paid for the gate at Musquash. M Badois stated the Commission did. M Byerly stated the gates are at the Musquash to keep out all-terrain vehicles. D Lievens asked who M Badois had spoken with. M Badois stated Lisa Drabik. B Maxwell stated in his opinion, he thought the Commission should approve the plan, but have the Town fund it, as they are already the land owner. B Maxwell made a motion to approve the plan and ask the Town to fund it as it is not a Conservation Commission issue, but rather a property owner/crime issue. G Harrington seconded the motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0.

Open Space Task Force: M Badois asked if anyone had looked at it. D Lievens stated that she had and could not find her file, which was a 3 page document, on what the Commission could do with short-term and long-term goals. B Maxwell stated he thought it was time to redo this and try to engage the community. He stated he did not understand why the Commission cannot get approval for a bond if property were to become available. M Byerly stated that he had been thinking about a warrant article that designated a percentage of the unassigned fund balance every year to go to the Conservation Fund. J Christenson-Collins asked what other Conservation Commissions in the area do. G Harrington stated that a lot of other towns do not have the pressure of open space that Londonderry has right now.

John Wilson, Londonderry resident: John Wilson, a resident of Londonderry, stated that he had never been to a Conservation Commission meeting before, and had been following the Griffin Road parcel with the Town Council meetings. He stated that in his opinion, he thought the Town would by 67-68 acres of land, of which 38 acres are protected because of wetlands. He noted that left 30 acres and if the data on the Town website is correct, could lead to maybe a dozen single family lots to build. He stated that from a practical point of view, for the Town to spend \$750,000 to stop the building of those 12 single family lots, seems very expensive. He stated that the question in his mind is what the Town could



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do with the \$750,000 if the Town did not purchase the land. He stated that he would like to see the Conservation Commission buy more land that would prevent the kind of buildup on 101A from Nashua to Milford. He stated he would like to protect, Route 102, Route 28 and Mammoth Road from becoming that. He stated that no one can stop the development, but it can be broken up with green space, open space or conservation space. M Badois asked if he had looked at the master plan, because the areas that he spoke about, are the areas that are planned for commercial development. He stated that he had, and he is not saying to stop the development, but to break it up with green space. M Badois stated that comes up more with zoning and planning as the developer is required to keep a certain percentage green. He stated that he did not think the purchasing of the Griffin land would have as much impact as breaking up the developments along Route 102 and Route 28 for generations to come. B Maxwell stated that his question is valid and aesthetics is a small piece of the Conservation Commission's charter. He noted that every 100 SF of land in Londonderry has been rated for Conservation Land and Griffin Road is rated pretty high, as it is a combination of upland which feeds into wetland. He stated that a big part of the Conservation Commission's charter is to protect the wetlands. He stated that Griffin land is a large contiguous block of land, and there are not many left in town, that has upland and protects wetlands in a chunk that is big enough for potential Conservation recreational value. G Harrington stated that the town does not really look favorably on the Conservation Commission purchasing land that is tax positive, which would be industrial commercial land. J Wilson stated that he has read the master plan and in his opinion it is almost worthless, as the town has not done anything that was written in it, as no fundamental change to zoning has occurred. M Badois stated that J Wilson might want to look at the open space plan on the Conservation Commission's webpage that explains how the Commission evaluates properties. M Byerly stated that there is still an opportunity to make the zoning different on Route 102 coming from Hudson, to try and make commercial have more green space. G Harrington stated that would be under the Planning Boards discretion. J Wilson thanked the Commission for letting him speak tonight.

David Ellis: D Ellis handed M Badois a booklet stating that replaces all previous booklets. He stated he would be at the Musquash Field Day this Saturday, February 17, 2018.

Griffin Road: J Christenson-Collins asked what had transpired at the last Town Council meeting. M Badois stated that it was continued again. She stated that the Town wants to lower the price, but did not make a lower bid on the property, and questioned how the Town Council could be in negotiation if it appears as if no one is talking with each other. She stated that the land owner's attorney stated they were not interested in lower the price. M Badois stated she was told that once it goes to the Town Council it is out of the hands of the Joint Negotiating Committee (JNC) or the Conservation Commission, and it is the Town Council's prerogative to negotiate. R Fillio stated that usually one does not go to the person selling it and ask them to lower the price, usually one would make them an offer. M Badois



105 stated that was exactly the land owner's point, as they would be negotiating against themselves. M 106 Badois wondered why the Town Council was deviating from the standard procedure that had been in 107 place for so long and hoped the deal would not fall through. J Christenson-Collins asked if M Badois had 108 talked to anyone to express her frustration. M Badois stated she has met with Kevin Smith, Town 109 Manager, and Tom Dolan, Town Council. B Maxwell stated maybe she should speak with Rick Brideau, 110 Town Assessor, for an evaluation. M Badois stated that was her idea to have the assessor come in to 111 speak with the Town Council, as she thought they might not understand the appraisal report. G Harrington stated that if anyone from the Commission sees a Town Council on Saturday at the 112 113 Musquash Field Day, to ask them about Griffin Road. 114 Water Extraction Ordinance: M Badois stated that she had sent Ted Combes an email asking for the 115 status and has received no response. 116 **New Business:** 117 Turtle monitoring: M Badois informed the Commission that New Hampshire Fish and Game wants to do 118 a Blanding and spotted turtle survey this season, but a representative could not make it to tonight's 119 meeting. She stated that someone will be presenting on March 13, 2018 from New Hampshire Fish and 120 Game about turtle monitoring. 121 Revisions to Env-Wt 100-900 wetland rules: M Badois asked if everyone had received the email she 122 sent out regarding the proposed draft about the revisions. D Lievens stated that there is an open 123 meeting in Concord regarding this and this is still the first draft. She stated the draft will go to JLCAR 124 (Joint Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules) where the final draft will be executed. She 125 recommended the Commission look over the draft. She stated that the goal is to make it simpler. 126 Deliberative: M Badois informed the Commission that at the deliberative session on Saturday, Peter 127 Curro's warrant article was reduced to \$250,000 and he kept emphasizing it was to prevent 128 developments. B Maxwell stated that there seemed to be confusion over what type of land the 129 Conservation Commission can buy and what the Commission can do with land it purchases and 130 suggested that the Commission should try to educate the residents about this information. **Email from ARM:** M Badois stated she received an email from ARM stating pre-proposal applications 131 132 are due April 30, 2018 and the application itself is due August 31, 2018. She stated there is \$2.6 million 133 available in the Merrimack River Watershed. M Badois stated they are interested in culvert projects. M 134 Badois stated that she thought M Speltz asked someone for a list of culverts crossed with Conservation 135 land. J Christenson-Collins asked what the next step was. B Maxwell stated that the Commission needs 136 to come up with a list of requests because if the Commission does not put in a request the money will go



137 to the other towns. D Lievens suggested contacting Colleen Mailloux, Town Planner or John Trottier, 138 P.E., Assistant Director of Public Works and Engineering. 139 DRC 140 Enviro Totes (Map 28 Lot 20-1A): The Commissioners reviewed the DRC for Enviro totes commenting 141 that it is not clear enough to determine as to what if anything is changing beyond the change of use. 142 Minutes: The Commissioners went over the non-public minutes from January 23, 2018. G Harrington 143 made a motion to accept the minutes as amended. D Lievens seconded the motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0. 144 145 The Commissioners went over the public minutes from February 10, 2018. B Maxwell made a motion to 146 accept the minutes as amended. R Fillio seconded the motion. The motion passed, 4-0-3, with D Lievens, 147 G Harrington, and R Fillio abstaining. 148 The Commissioners went over the public minutes from January 23, 2018. G Harrington made a motion 149 to accept the minutes as amended. R Fillio seconded the motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0. 150 Adjournment: G Harrington made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 9:38 p.m. R Fillio seconded the motion.
