9 Marge Badois called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. She appointed M Speltz to vote for R Fillio and R

10 Floyd to vote for D Lievens

11 Old Business

12 Kendall Pond clean-up day: B Maxwell informed the Commission that he walked the trail and did not

- 13 think the clean-up would be too bad. M Badois said that the Commission could get tools, such as a
- 14 chainsaw and trail trimmer, if needed. M Speltz asked B Maxwell how many pictures he had recently
- 15 gone through from the Kendall Pond camera. B Maxwell stated about 1400 pictures and there were
- some night triggers. He noted that any not normal activity he had forwarded to the police. M Byerly
- asked B Maxwell if he could extrapolate the pictures into how many people used Kendall Pond over a
- 18 period of time. B Maxwell pointed out that the camera will take two pictures every time it is triggered,
- 19 but he thought the number of people using Kendall Pond over a period of thirty days would be in the
- 20 low hundreds. M Badois said the Kendall Pond clean-up would be at 9 a.m. this Sunday.
- 21 Griffin Road: M Badois said that she is still confused how the money was taken out of the account
- 22 without her signing off on it. She asked if there is a policy or procedure in place for this. M Speltz said M
- 23 Badois should talk to Doug Smith, Finance Director, and thought they might have considered the
- 24 Commission's vote on Griffin Road the authority to make the expenditure. M Badois noted that when
- 25 the Commission votes to approve expenses, she is still signing authorization for the funds to come out of
- the account. She also pointed out that the reported deed for Griffin Road has no mention of
- 27 conservation in it. She said that Kevin Smith, Town Manager, stated since it was purchased with
- 28 conservation money, so therefore, it is conservation. She asked how the conservation restrictions for
- 29 this property would be recorded. M Speltz informed her that there are no conservation restrictions on
- 30 this property because there is an advantage to having no restrictions as this property might be used in
- 31 the future as a match for a grant. M Badois voiced her concern with no mention of conservation
- 32 anywhere in the deed that fifty years from now, the town might not remember why the land was
- 33 purchased and sell it. M Speltz said that he would email the town assistant attorney about correcting
- the deed.



36 Water resource management: M Badois informed the Commission that it should be posted now and 37 asked if the Commission should send it to prime candidates for bidding. M Speltz said he thought the 38 newspaper announcement would draw enough attention for candidates for bidding. M Badois asked if there would be any grant resources that could be used for this. M Speltz said he looked and could not 39 40 find a good match. A Kizak stated there was nothing that she knew of for grants either. M Badois asked 41 M Speltz what she needed to know in order to be the contact person when he is away. M Speltz stated 42 he would check his email once a day when away. A Kizak offered to have the emails forwarded to her also. M Badois noted that P Commerford from the Planning Board is very interested to be on the task 43 44 force and asked when a task force would be created. M Speltz stated that Kevin Smith, Town Manager, 45 should appoint the committee for this study with representatives from the Planning Board, Department of Public Works and Engineering, Planning Department, an at-large member and if possible a Town 46 47 Council member. M Badois said she would email Kevin Smith about this. 48 Gilcreast Road abandoned orchard: M Speltz informed the Commission that the state has a program 49 called the Brownfield Assessment Program or the Brownfield Remediation Program, which helps 50 potentially contaminated properties be cleaned up for redevelopment. He said he emailed someone 51 asking if the Gilcreast property would be suitable for this program noting the response was a yes to the 52 property, but a caveat is the funding bucket. He said when the funding bucket is empty, they cannot 53 accept any more projects, and said this project might be on the table for early next year. He pointed out 54 that the project is performed in three phases with Phase 1 consisting of a record check of the site and a 55 walk around, Phase 2 are dirt samples and Phase 3 is the clean-up. He said he will brief the Town Council 56 about this project in November, as he needs the Town Council permission to apply for a grant. He said if 57 the Town Council approves, he will then submit an application. M Noone asked what the property would 58 be used for if the application was accepted. M Speltz said it could be used for public access, such as a 59 walking path. M Noone asked why the Town Council would be interested in this. M Speltz stated that for

- 60 starters the Town Council wants this property to look better.
- 61 Land Acquisition Policy: M Speltz stated he submitted the draft to the assistant town attorney and 62 Kevin Smith and would check back in with them. M Badois said that she is concerned about having a 63 process in place to make sure that the Commission is included before money is taken out their account, 64 after the issues with Griffin Road.

65 New Business:

- 66 Liberty Utilities repair of drainage on Liberty Dr: M Badois informed the Commission that Liberty
- 67 Utilities contacted her stating that they need to fix some drainage on Liberty Drive behind the 603
- 68 Brewery, which they believe is due to an old retention basin that is not functioning properly. She read
- 69 the summary from Liberty Utilities to the Commission about the project. She noted that there is no need



- for any state permitting, as this is a manmade pond that is being maintained. G Harrington said that he
- thought there is a special use permit, which is issued to clean out drainage swales. M Badois asked if
- 72 anyone needed to do a site walk or if the Commission was okay with this explanation. The
- 73 Commissioners agreed the explanation was fine and no site walk was needed.
- 74 **Budget:** M Badois stated it was budget season and she usually requests the exact same budget every
- 75 year unless there is something specific that is needed. M Speltz said he would like to see a ranger
- 76 position in the Commission's budget. B Maxwell asked if the Commission should ask for trail
- 77 maintenance equipment in the budget. M Badois said that the Commission donates to Trailways and
- 78 Trailways allows the Commission to borrow equipment when needed. M Speltz asked about having a
- summer trail intern on the budget. M Badois said she liked this idea over the ranger and asked how
- 80 much the Commission would like to pay an intern. M Byerly calculated about \$7200 for three months. M
- 81 Speltz said to make it \$10,000 and have the official name be contracted trail and conservation area
- 82 maintainer.
- 83 **NHACC:** M Badois asked the Commission who was planning on attending the conference. She said the
- 84 price will go up after October 19, 2018, so it should be decided who will attend before this date. M
- 85 Badois stated she would research the previous motion made by the committee regarding the cost to
- 86 attend and get back to them.
- 87 Garrabedian: G Harrington asked if anyone knew if the Planning Board signed off on the Kings Road
- 88 subdivision. A Kizak said she did not know and would ask someone tomorrow and email him. G
- 89 Harrington stated he was curious because of the timber law regarding subdivisions.
- 90 Wetlands: M Badois informed the Commission that someone anonymously reported wetlands being
- 91 destroyed on Wiley Hill Road. She said she passed it along to Richard Canuel, Chief Building Inspector,
- 92 Health Officer, Zoning Administrator & Code Enforcement Officer, but he is out right now, so she
- 93 forwarded it to Brad Anderson, Code Enforcement Officer, who is covering.
- 94 **Complaint:** M Speltz stated that he filed a complaint with New Hampshire Department of
- 95 Environmental Services (NHDES) regarding the dirt moved from an adjacent wetland from Groundhog
- 96 Landscaping premises. He pointed out that from an aerial view the encroachments he found appear to
- 97 be true and he turned over the evidence to the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT).
- 98 Minutes: The Commissioners went over the public minutes from September 11, 2018. M Byerly made a
- 99 motion to accept the minutes as presented. M Noone seconded the motion. The motion passed, 5-0-2
- 100 with R Floyd and M Speltz abstaining.
- 101 **DRC**



- 102 Wallace Farm Condo Conversion (Map 16 Lot 3): The Commissioners reviewed the DRC from Wallace
- Farm condo conversion commenting that if there is some sort of violation that has a natural resources
 impact it may be extremely difficult to assign responsibility and enforce restoration.
- 105 **Braeburn Drive Subdivision (Map 9 Lot 5):** The Commissioners reviewed the DRC from Braeburn Drive
- subdivision commenting that in Lot# 5-9 there is a structure near the vernal pool that will compromise
- 107 its value. The Commissioners recommend a fifty foot natural buffer around the vernal pool in Lot #5-9 to
- 108 maintain the rare habitat.
- 109 Amendment to Wetland Permit for sewage line extension under Route 102: The Commissioners
- 110 reviewed the amendment to the Wetland Permit with no comments.
- 111 Adjournment: M Byerly made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 9:06 p.m. M Noone seconded the
- 112 motion. The motion passed, 7-0-0.
