

1 **LONDONDERRY, NH MASTER PLAN STEERING COMMITTEE MINUTES OF THE**
2 **NOVEMBER 28, 2012 MEETING IN THE MOOSE HILL COUNCIL CHAMBERS**

18 **I. Call to Order**
19

20 Leitha Reilly called the meeting to order at 7 PM.
21

22 **II. Approval of Minutes (September 26, 2012; October 24, 2012 Steering**
23 **Committee Meeting Minutes; and October 24, 2012 Citizen Workshop**
24 **#3 Minutes)**
25

26 On page two of the September 26, 2012 minutes, M. Speltz suggested that
27 although the words "priority" and "priorities" (lines 110 and 128 respectively)
28 were used in the discussion of the implementation matrix, they should be
29 changed to reflect the issue as one of a sequence of tasks, as opposed to
30 implying that any one task is more important than the other. **M. Soares made**
31 **a motion to approve and sign the minutes from the September 26, 2012**
32 **meeting as amended. B. Saur seconded the motion. No discussion. Vote**
33 **on the motion: 9-0-1.** (M. Tetreau abstained as she was absent from the
34 September 26, 2012 meeting).

36 **B. Saur made a motion to approve and sign the minutes from the**
37 **October 24, 2012 meeting. M. Srugis seconded the motion. No**
38 **discussion. Vote on the motion: 8-0-2.** (L. O'Sullivan and M. Speltz
39 abstained as they were absent from the October 24, 2012 meeting).

41 **M. Tetreau made a motion to approve and sign the minutes from the**
42 **October 24, 2012 Citizen Workshop #3. B. Mee seconded the motion.**
43 **No discussion. Vote on the motion: 8-0-2.** (L. O'Sullivan and M. Speltz
44 abstained as they were absent from the October 24, 2012 meeting).
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46 [L. Whittemore arrived at 7:36].

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III. Review of the Final Master Plan Document

B. Wright and M. Noonkester noted that this draft, delivered on November 20, incorporates input received at both the October 24 Citizen Workshop #3 and the subsequent October 24 meeting. More local photographs were also included, as was a diagram per the Steering Committee's request to accompany the implementation matrix.

Resident Ann Chiampa left the meeting at approximately 7:30 PM after reiterating her objection with the first full sentence in the second column on page seven (i.e. that "Many residents interviewed at Planapalooza overcame misgivings about the suburban character of the Town because enrolling their children in the Londonderry school system was more important to them). The sentence, she said, reflects negatively on the town since her observation is that not only did most residents move to Londonderry because of the school system, but also precisely because of the rural, suburban character of the town. M. Srugis brought up a procedural question about "back and forth" with the public and the potential for a "running debate." The Chair responded with her decision to hold public comment until the end. B. Saur made a public invitation to residents watching the live broadcast to attend and provide their input.

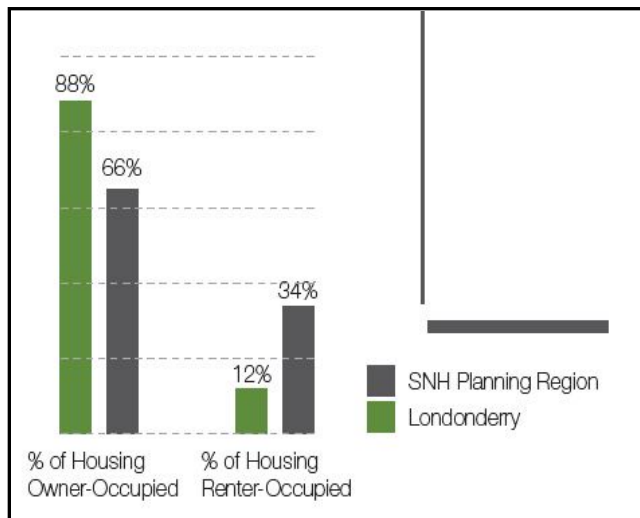
Additional changes were discussed and decided upon as follows:

- Steering Committee members will continue to forward typographical errors to staff.
- Date all sources throughout the document and place them consistently on each page (e.g. left or right justified). Add a notation at the beginning or end the document explaining that when multiple sources are listed at the bottom of a page, they refer to all the items located there, not just to the specific item under which they are placed.
- Page 7, second column, first full sentence: The word "many" was challenged for its accuracy. TPUDC confirmed that citizen input was the genesis for that statement. Consensus: Do not remove the word "many."
- Pages 28-29:
 - Note the source used for the "Timeline of Londonderry, NH," i.e. Marilyn Ham's *History of Londonderry* as included in the 2004 Master Plan.
 - Add the adoption of the Town Charter in 1996 to the timeline, as well as the construction and opening of the High School in 1978 with a corresponding picture). Remove the reference to the

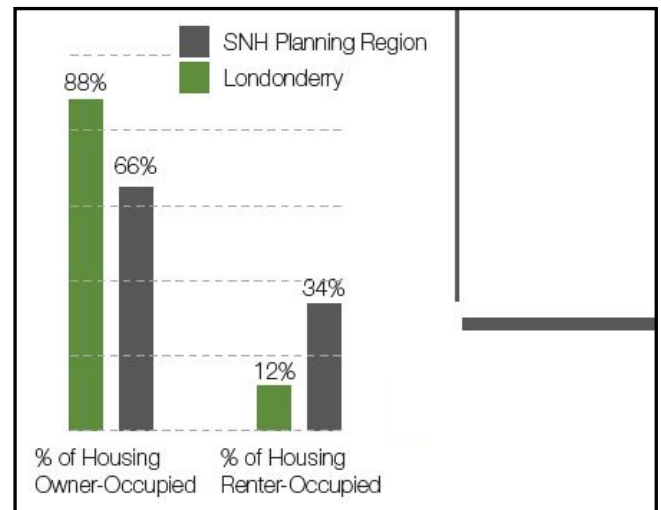
92 organization in 2007 of the Housing Task Force to create the
93 necessary space.

- 94 • Page 48: Move the legend for the graphic in the lower left hand corner of
95 the page (regarding owner versus renter-occupied housing) to the upper
96 right hand corner of that bar graph, i.e.:

- 109
- 110 • Page 49: Add the words "of the 13 in the Southern New Hampshire
111 Planning Region" to the mid-page graphic on the right hand side, after
112 the words "Londonderry is the most affluent municipality per capita."
- 113 • Page 54:
 - 114 ○ First column; reduce the size of the space before the last
115 sentence.
 - 116 ○ Second column; delete the last sentence under the "Little Cohas
117 Marsh," and replace with "Public access will be provided by the
118 envisioned Rail Trail which runs through the area".
- 119 • Page 55, first column, under the "Estey Conservation Easement":
120 Remove "since it is not in Town ownership" in the middle of the last
121 sentence.
- 122 • Page 60:
 - 123 ○ The inclusion of the Levels of Service A, B, E, and F was
124 questioned since no roads in Londonderry meet those levels.
125 Consensus: Keep all Levels of Service to provide perspective and
126 information.

- 127 ○ Change heading of the last paragraph from "Level of Service &
128 Traffic Counts" to "Average Daily Traffic Volumes."
129
- 130 • Page 67, second column, second full sentence: Include the Londonderry
131 Youth Soccer Association (LYSA) and Londonderry United Soccer Club
132 (LUSC) in the list of groups that maintain recreational land. Identify all
133 groups in that sentence by their acronym to be consistent.
134
- 135 • Page 68; Add the ALERT team with a brief description of their purpose to
136 the Hazard Mitigation page.
137
- 138 • Page 69, second column: Add the year the "Hazard Mitigation Goals for
139 the Town of Londonderry" were established to that heading to make it
140 clear that they are not recommended goals but are already in existence.
141
- 142 • Page 76, bottom graphics: Add an explanation of the meaning of the
143 stars associated with the two development scenarios; e.g. "The number of
144 stars indicates the degree of consistency in each category with each
145 Guiding Principle."
146
- 147 • Pages 74 and 75: Move the legend of each map further down on the page
148 so they do not cover the southwest corner of town since it is later
149 identified as a key growth sector (p. 153).
150
- 151 • Page 79, third sentence: Add the words "of the six" before the words
152 "five Guiding Principles from this Comprehensive Master Plan."
153
- 154 • Page 153:
155
- 156 ○ The proposed moderately intensive development southwest of
157 Scobie Pond is inappropriate given the area's difficult access,
158 surrounding wetlands, and value of the land as a protective buffer
159 to the water quality of both Scobie Pond and the large wetland
160 northeast of route 28. TPUDC responded that eliminating that
161 proposed area of development would cause major changes to
162 population and employment projections that would ripple
163 throughout the plan, making it impossible to deliver a final draft on
164 time.
165
- 166 ○ Include language regarding conservation protection to the
167 descriptions of the Growth Sectors so they are consistent with the
168 Green Print map on page 193. The wording, however, should not
169 imply any kind of land taking on the part of the Town. (Staff will
170 create new language)

- 171 ○ First column; under "O-2 Reserved Open Sector," strike the words
172 "candidate open space from the Open Space Task Force Report."
- 173 ○ It was noted that some aspects of the map have changed since the
174 last draft that perhaps should not have (beyond a change in some
175 of the colors). Staff worked with Steering Committee members
176 after the meeting to verify and address this.
- 177
- 178 • Pages 158- 159: It was suggested to add an eighth use to allow for
179 residential uses that support the Pettengill Road Industrial Village.
180 Consensus: The issue is one that would be more appropriately discussed
181 during the implementation of the plan, specifically if and when the zoning
182 ordinance is amended.
- 183
- 184 • Page 209, first column, second paragraph: Define what the "ISO Rating"
185 is and explain the importance of improving it.
- 186
- 187 • Page 211 (Regulatory Flow Chart):
- 188 ○ Add the newly created "Master Plan Implementation" flow chart as
189 page 212. Although it was previously discussed that the chart
190 should be an addendum to the Master Plan so as to allow for the
191 ability to amend it after adoption of the Master Plan, it was decided
192 that with some small edits, it could be included as page 212;
- 193 ➤ Replace the words in the first gray box on the left from
194 "Enhance the Municipal Advantage," (since it is a guiding
195 principle), with the words "Promote Partnerships to Foster
196 Economic Development."
- 197 ➤ Add a blue box to the left of "Formation of Implementation
198 Plan/Committees" that states "Coordinate with Town Boards
199 and Committees," with an arrow pointing in both directions
200 between the two.
- 201 ○ Add descriptions to each chart to explain that the Regulatory Flow
202 Chart identifies the legal relationship of the Master Plan within the
203 local and State framework and that the Master Plan Implementation
204 flow chart describes how concepts in the Master Plan can become
205 Town policy.
- 206
- 207 • It was suggested to add some form of numbering or lettering to the
208 implementation matrix to allow an implementation committee to more
209 easily sort the excel spreadsheet. Consensus: Do not add anything
210 because it may imply priorities which are entirely up to the
211 Implementation Committee.

213 **IV. Next Steps**

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215 Staff will assemble the edits and forward them to TPUDC who will in turn
216 generate a revised pdf draft for the Committee to review. The January 3, 2013
217 meeting may not be necessary, but will remain on the schedule.
