Miscellaneous

- Vinnie and Nick Curro attended the meeting to show the committee the new solid waste videos and to get the committee's comments. Only three of the five videos were previewed. Vinnie will find out about the remaining videos and will come to the May meeting. The committee discussed the videos that they reviewed and Paul gathered their comments.
- Marty said that the Rec Department was willing to collect the used sports
 equipment at one location. Marty is looking at where the best location would be
 to collect the equipment. Bob said that all he needs to know is where the location

will be and he will see that it gets collected. Marty will attend the April Rec Department meeting.

 Duane is still checking into the prescription drug drop off box in the Plymouth MA Police station. He is in contact with the Town and is waiting for some additional information.

 Duane will wait until spring to contact Wolfeboro regarding their HHW drop off center. Bob did speak with the Town's HHW rep when he attended an environmental meeting and got some information. Associated costs will need to be gotten.

Main Topics

- The committee discussed the broken Londonderry sign. Bob said that the
 insurance company of the person who hit the sign gave a check to the Town but
 the check did not cover the entire cost of a new sign. The committee is looking at
 ways to finance the remaining costs for the new sign. Paul said that he was going
 to call Steve to discuss this issue.
- The committee continued their discussion regarding the collection and recycling of CFLs. Bob said that he would try and get a sign posted in Town Hall as an educational tool on the proper disposal of the CFLs. Also, having an ad in the Londonderry Times to educate the public was discussed. The committee is looking into the feasibility of an incentive strategy for residents to bring CFL's to the drop off center, keeping mercury out of Londonderry's waste stream.
- Paul passed out information on paint recycling. A bill is in the NH Legislature looking for approval of having latex and oil based paint recycling. The committee agreed to support the bill on this issue.
