# Acceptance of Minutes:

The minutes from the December meeting were approved

- Bob said that the DPW had picked up the tires along the rail trail and that he had placed the flushables flyer on the web site.
- Paul discussed the going green columns for the Londonderry Times (LT). Paul was able to speak with Deb Paul and she said to send the columns to her. A light bulb cost comparison is the latest column submitted. Joy is working on an article on plants and we should see that in the paper sometime this spring.
- Paul was also concerned that new multi-family housing in Londonderry was not addressing solid waste and recycling space adequately during the planning phases of the projects. Bob assured the committee that solid waste and recycling collection and having enough collection containers is one of the items that the Town looks at in new projects.
- Bob received the sponsor sign for the flea market Welcome sign that was in bad shape. Bob gave the sign to Duane who will install it in January.
- Bob has rearranged the location and labeling of the videos on the website so it will be easier to find them.

#### Main Topics

- Bob will discuss what he learned at the NRRA conference that he attended in June at the next meeting.
- The committee discussed partnering with two local auto repair businesses as possible outlets for waste oil collection for those residents who might not be able to make it to oil collection days on the first Saturday of each month. Paul prepared a flyer that he was going to review with the two businesses to make sure they understood what was going to be expected of them if they decided to move forward. The committee thought we might want to add one business only to start.
- Bob said that the DPW decided to open up the drop off center for Saturday, January 7th for the sole purpose of residents being able to drop off extra recycling that they may have accumulated during the holiday season. The date that they picked turned out to be a nice day and they had approximately 129 vehicles drop off recyclables. They did not accept any other materials that are normally taken at the drop off center. The DPW is looking into possibly doing this next year. They are not sure how well it might work if the date chosen would have been a bad weather day.
- Bob discussed the sharps kiosk that the DPW is planning on placing in the Town Hall for sharps disposal. He said that the kiosk might be operational in about three months.
- The committee went over each member's action items and updated the list.
