ORDINANCE #2016-02 (A)

AN AMENDMENT TO THE MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 1, CHAPTER XXIX, DOGS TITLE IV-PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE, CHAPTER VIII – ANIMAL CONTROL

WHEREAS	there is a need to provide for the health and safety of the public in the Town of Londonderry;
WHEREAS	to further provide public safety, there is the need to prohibit dogs from: a. Running at large; b. Fouling; and c. Creating disturbing noise; and
WHEREAS	the Town Council has the authority pursuant to RSA 39:31, and Town Charter to enact such regulations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Londonderry that the Municipal Code of the Town of Londonderry, Title I—General Code, Chapter XXIX (newly created chapter) Dogs, Title IV – Public Health, Safety and Welfare, Chapter VIII – Animal Control, is hereby amended as attached (Attached please find the current Ordinance, Title IV, Chapter VIII- Animal Control, #1; the original proposed Ordinance, 2016-02, #2 & the current proposed amendment to Title IV, Chapter VIII, #3.)

CHAPTER VIII - ANIMAL CONTROL

SECTION I DEFINITIONS

- A. "Dog" shall mean both male and female, altered or not.
- B. "Owner" shall mean any person owning, keeping, harboring, or assuming the care of a dog.
- C. "Running at Large" shall mean off the premises of owner or keeper and not under the control of the owner or a responsible person.

SECTION II LICENSING AND REGISTRATION

- A. All dogs kept, harbored or maintained by their owners in the Town shall be licensed and registered as specified in RSA 466 and as it may be amended, of the State of New Hampshire
- B. Any person found to be keeping, harboring or maintaining an unlicensed dog shall be required to license the dog at the office of the Town Clerk within ten (10) days of notice and at the time of registration, pay to the Town an additional fee of ten dollars (\$10).
- C. Failure to register the dog and pay the fee shall require the person to be summonsed to court for the violation of RSA 466 and to receive the punishment thereof.

SECTION III RUNNING AT LARGE

- A. The Town Council shall provide for the rigid enforcement of RSA 466 and take such steps as they may deem necessary to ensure compliance with its provisions by residents of the Town.
- B. In accordance with the provisions of RSA 466:30-A, it shall be unlawful for an owner of any dog licensed or unlicensed to permit the dog to run at large, except when accompanied by the owner or custodian and when used for hunting, herding, supervised competition and exhibition or training for such.

CHAPTER VIII - ANIMAL CONTROL (Cont'd)

SECTION IV IMPOUNDING

A. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer to apprehend any dog found running at large without a collar and valid license tag. Any injury or death of the animal caused in the effort of its apprehension shall be the responsibility of the owner and no liability shall be found with the Animal Control Officer or his assistants.

SECTION V METHOD OF CONFINEMENT

A. The Town Council, with the assistance and cooperation of the Animal Control Officer, shall select a suitable place of confinement for impounded dogs. Suitable shall include good food and care.

SECTION VI NOTICE TO OWNERS, REDEMPTION

- A. If the dog has upon it the name or address of the owner or such name or address is otherwise known or obtainable, then the Police Department or the Animal Control Officer shall notify the owner within twenty four (24) hours after seizure of the dog.
- B. Notice of impoundment shall be in writing by registered mail, postage prepaid, and shall be construed as having been given at the time of posting thereof.
- C. If the dog impounded does not have the name or address of the owner, and if the owner is not otherwise known, then no notice shall be necessary.
- D. The owner of any dog so impounded may reclaim the dog upon payment of the sum of ten dollars (\$10) for the first twenty four hour (24 hr) period or any part thereof that the dog is held and three dollars (\$3) for each twenty four hour (24 hr) period or any part thereof that the dog is held thereafter; provided, however, that before release to any person, if the dog is not licensed, a license as required by the Town shall be secured.

SECTION VII FEES

A. The sum collected pursuant to the provisions of the Ordinance shall be accounted for and paid over to the Londonderry Town Clerk.

CHAPTER VIII - ANIMAL CONTROL (Cont'd)

SECTION VIII DISPOSITION OF UNCLAIMED DOGS

- A. Any properly collared and tagged dog which has been impounded and has not been redeemed by the owner shall be turned over to the nearest Animal Rescue League provided that any such dog shall be held for at least ten (10) days after impounding.
- B. In those cases where it is required that notice be given the owner, the ten (10) days shall commence from the date the owner is notified.
- C. In the event the Animal Rescue League is unwilling or unable to accept custody of the dog, the dog shall be disposed of as directed by the Town Council
- D. Any uncollared, untagged dog whose owner cannot be identified shall be held for a minimum of ten (10) days and after such time, if the owner cannot be determined, the dog shall be disposed of in the manner prescribed by the Town Council.

SECTION IX DOG OFFICER APPOINTED

- A. The Town Manager shall appoint an Animal Control Officer and shall determine the amount of his pay.
- B. The Officer shall be selected from candidates having knowledge of animals and their care.
- C. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer to enforce the provisions of his Ordinance and perform such other duties in respect thereto as the Town Council shall determine.
- D. The Animal Control Officer shall be appointed as a Special Patrolman.

SECTION X PENALTY

A. Any person found violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be found guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10) nor more than twenty dollars (\$20) for such offense.

CHAPTER XXIX - Dogs

SECTION I - AUTHORITY

A. The enabling legislation is <u>RSA 39:31</u>, and Title I – General Code, Chapter XXIX.

SECTION II – RUNNING AT LARGE PROHIBITED

- A. No owner, possessor, controller, or keeper of any dog shall permit such dog, whether licensed or unlicensed to run at large within the Town of Londonderry at any time.
- B. Notwithstanding anything in this section to the contrary, no person shall be compelled to keep any dog in his possession on a leash while in or upon any public street, alley, park, parkway, cemetery, town forest, trail-way or other public place in the Town of Londonderry, if the dog is securely confined in an vehicle.
- C. Notwithstanding any definition to the contrary, a dog shall be deemed "at large" if the dog is in, on, or being walked upon, a public street, park, parkway, cemetery, town forest, trail-way or other public place in the Town of Londonderry, or a public street, sidewalk or right-of-way adjacent to a public place and is not secured by a leash or chain or within a carrier which is in the possession of a person of sufficient strength and age to effectively restrain the dog.

SECTION III - DOG FOULING PROHIBITION

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, possessing, or controlling a dog on street, park, parkway, cemetery, town forest, trail-way or other public place in the Town of Londonderry, any public street, sidewalk or right-of-way adjacent to a public place, or on any private property neither owned nor occupied by said person to:
 - i. Fail to remove and dispose of any feces left by the dog in or on such public or private property.

SECTION IV - NOISE REGULATION

A. It shall be unlawful to keep any animal, including a bird, in a manner that causes frequent or long continued noise that disturbs the comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity.

SECTION V – ENFORCEMENT

A. The Londonderry Animal Control Officer and/or the Londonderry Police Department may seize, impound or restrain any dog in violation of this chapter, and deliver said dog to an authorized boarding shelter for dogs. Such dogs shall be handled as strays or abandoned dogs pursuant to applicable laws.

SECTION VI - VIOLATION AND PENALTIES

A. In addition to impounding a dog found at large or in violation of this chapter, the Londonderry Animal Control officer and/or Londonderry Police Department may issue in the name of the owner, possessor, controller, or keeper of such dog a notice of violation. Such notice shall impose upon the owner, possessor, controller, or keeper of such a dog a forfeiture of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) which must be paid to the Londonderry Town Clerk within 96 hours of the date and time notice is given, in full satisfaction of the assessed penalty. In the event that such penalty is not paid to the Londonderry Town Clerk within the time limitation specified, a summons shall be issued for appearance in Derry District Court, and any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a violation.

Dog that barks for sustained periods of time, or during the night so as to disturb the peace and quiet of the neighborhood or area

SECTION VI ENFORCEMENT

The Londonderry Animal Control Officer and/or the Londonderry Police Department may seize, impound or restrain any dog in violation of this chapter, and deliver said dog to an authorized boarding shelter for dogs. Such dogs shall be handled as strays or abandoned dogs pursuant to applicable laws.

SECTION VII IMPOUNDING

It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer to apprehend any dog found running at large, as defined or running at large without a collar and valid license tag. Any injury or death of the animal caused in the effort of its apprehension shall be the responsibility of the owner and no liability shall be found with the Animal Control Officer or his assistants. The Animal Control Officer shall have the responsibility to investigate violations of Section IV and Section V of this Chapter and take action consistent with this Chapter.

The Town Council, with the assistance and cooperation of the Animal Control Officer, shall select a suitable place of confinement for impounded dogs. Suitable shall include good food and care.

Such notice shall impose upon the owner, possessor, controller, or keeper of such a dog a forfeiture of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) which must be paid to the Londonderry Town Clerk within 96 hours of the date and time notice is given, in full satisfaction of the assessed penalty. In the event that such penalty is not paid to the Londonderry Town Clerk within the time limitation specified, a summons shall be issued for appearance in Derry District Court, and any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a violation.

The High School generator was on hold due to auditorium so that is up and running and we need a motion from Board to withdraw money from maintenance trust for the trustees to release the funds from the account that they hold on behalf of the school. Mr. Young goes over the completed projects per the handout.

Mr. Laferriere made a motion to allocate \$628,436.62 from the maintenance trust as noted on the maintenance reimbursement request as of 1/19/16. Mrs. Hendricks seconded the motion.

Mrs. Hendricks asked about the security upgrades. Mr. Curro said each year they do a bunch of upgrades like cameras that our outdated or wiring. *Motion passed 5-0-0*.

6.2 To see what action(s) the Board will take regarding withdrawal of funds from the Capital Equipment Reserve: Mr. Curro said this is for needs in the classroom and maintenance and is \$148,703.50. This includes items from grounds, athletics, equipment, etc. This is the third year, we reduce all the equipment needs from the operating budget and the capital equipment reserve special article is the funding mechanism for most of the equipment needs on an annual basis. Mr. Young said this is what we used to do through leasing and this replaces that now. Mr. Young goes over the list of items included in the \$148,703.50 amount in the packet.

Mr. Laferriere made a motion to release the funds of \$148,703.50 from the account Equipment Capital Reserve – reimbursement request as of 1/19/2016. Mrs. Hendricks seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0-0.

6.3 To see what action(s) the Board will take regarding withdrawal of funds from the School Impact Fee Account: Mr. Curro said this might be the last time we do this because as of today the Impact Fee Program is on hold. This takes down the money in the school impact fee account unless the Town brings back the impact fee program this will be it. This was used to help offset the cost of the High School renovations and additions in 2003 which included the second floor in phase 2, gymnasium and phase 6 second floor. The amount they will withdraw is \$117,000 in the financial report. Mr. Young asks Mr. Curro if we are accessing these funds and using in a legal manner. Mr. Curro said yes.

Mr. Laferriere made a motion requesting the release of funds from the Town Council at the sum of \$117,000 impact fees per requested by the District to deal with High School debt services. Mrs. Reilly seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0-0.

Middle School Program of Studies: Mr. Zacchilli, Principal and Mrs. Collacchi, Curriculum Coordinator present. They thank the Board for their support. Fifth grade parent night is February 10th in the Middle School cafeteria and the snow date is February 11th at 7:00pm. The eighth to ninth grade transition night has been completed. There are no major changes to the program guide. There are a few wording changes. All students take four core classes along with physical education and music. Mr. Zacchilli goes over the changes that are included in the packet. The Middle School is piloting two initiatives: the genius hour and the eighth grade seminar. Mrs. Collacchi goes over the eighth grade seminar. They met with the teams and explained the options and this is modeled after the senior project at the High School. The child picks a topic; works with a mentor of their choice then shows evidence of their learning in traditional and non-traditional ways. They are pleased with the number of students interested. They are in the process of helping the students to find mentors and will start up in the third semester. This work is done during ASD. Mrs. Hendricks asked when we have a student that can't

Chapter XXIV ENERGY SYSTEMS EXEMPTION POLICY

SECTION I PURPOSE

A. To adopt the provisions of RSA 72:61-68 and establish qualifications for the exemption for Energy Systems for Solar and Wind-Powered Systems.

SECTION II QUALIFICATIONS and DEFINITIONS

A. The energy exemption from property tax in the Town of Londonderry shall apply to any person who meets the requirement of either RSA 72:61, Solar Energy Systems; or RSA 72:65, Wind-Powered Systems on a yearly basis in an amount to be chosen by the Town.

SECTION III BENEFITS

- A. The exemption from property tax in the Town of Londonderry, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be based upon the value of the entire energy system meeting the requirements of state statutes. *up to a value of \$5,000.00*
- B. The exemption under this section shall apply only in taxable years during which the exemption is claimed on April 1 in any given year.
