### **ORDINANCE 2016-08**

# An Ordinance Relative to a Restriction on Removing Water from Public Bodies of Water for Commercial Use

First Reading: 10/17/16

Second Reading/Public Hearing: 11/07/16

Adopted: 11/07/16

WHEREAS On Friday, September 16, 2016, the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("NHDES") advised Town of Londonderry Town Manager Kevin Smith that drought conditions in the State of New Hampshire are sufficiently severe that NHDES is requesting that municipalities use their statutory authority under RSA 41:11-d to enact town-wide lawn watering bans for both private and public wells; and

**WHEREAS** As of September 1, 2016, NHDES has classified the Town of Londonderry as a municipality suffering from "severe" or "extreme" drought conditions; and

**WHEREAS** RSA 41:11 allows municipalities through their governing bodies to establish restrictions on the use of water from private wells or public water systems for residential outdoor lawn watering when a drought condition has been declared; and

**WHEREAS** the Town of Londonderry previously imposed a mandatory restriction on the watering of all residential lawns; and

**WHEREAS** concerns have been raised about the impact on the Town of Londonderry's public bodies of water and its other natural resources from landscaping and other businesses withdrawing water from public bodies for commercial use; and

**WHEREAS** Portions of Londonderry are already under some restrictions as put in place by the public water supply companies.

**NOW THEREFORE, the Town of Londonderry ordains** by the Londonderry Town Council that, in response to the severe and extreme drought conditions and the impacts therefrom facing the residents of Londonderry, effective November 7th, 2016, a mandatory restriction on the withdrawal of water from public bodies of water for commercial use is imposed. Enforcement of this restriction shall be completed by any sworn officer of the Town of Londonderry Police Department, which is hereby granted the authority to initiate any enforcement action against any violator of this restriction. Any person failing to comply with the restriction shall be deemed inviolation and subject to the following penalties pursuant to RSA 651:2: (1) a first violation, shall result ina warning; (2) asecond violation shall result a \$250 fine; and (3) each succeeding violation shall result in a \$500 fine.

## Accepting COPS Hiring Program Award

#### WHEREAS

The Office of Community Oriented Policing (COPS Office) has approved the Londonderry Police Department for two (2) positions under the 2016 Hiring Program; and

#### WHEREAS

The COPS Office has estimated that award for Londonderry is to be two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00), based on a local match of four hundred thirty five thousand, three hundred thirty five dollars (\$435,335.00); and

#### **WHEREAS**

The 2016 COPS Hiring Program (CHP) grant start date was September 1, 2016 and must be accepted within ninety (90) days, with drawdowns against the grant beginning by August 30, 2017 (to avoid the need to file an extension); and

#### WHEREAS

The Town of Londonderry, New Hampshire Town Council wishes to accept the CHP Grant Award Number 2016UMWX0165, understanding that the two conditions of acceptance are 1.) a commitment by the Town of Londonderry to retain all sworn officers funded under the 2016 CHP award for a minimum of twelve months following the thirty six (36) month federal funding period, and 2.) assurance that one of the two positions awarded is a veteran,

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Londonderry Town Council that we:

- 1. Accept CHP Grant Award Number 2016UMWX0165; and
- 2. Authorize funding to begin within the drawdown period and upon hiring of each individual sworn officer; and
