WHEREAS	Town Staff have prepared language consistent with the intent of the Ordinance; and
WHEREAS	the Planning Board has voted to recommend Town Council adoption of the proposed amendments;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Londonderry that Section 8.1.5 of the Zoning Ordinance shall be amended as posted.

Special Exceptions:

As outlined in the Table of Uses and throughout this ordinance, specific uses may be allowed in certain zoning districts through the process of obtaining a special exception from the Zoning Board of Adjustment. The Zoning Board of Adjustment may grant such special exceptions in appropriate cases and subject to appropriate conditions so as to be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance where the applicant(s) can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Zoning Board of Adjustment the following:

A. Such use will not be detrimental to the health or safety of residents;

B. Such use will not create undue traffic congestion or a traffic safety hazard in the vicinity of the proposed development;

C. Such use will not be incompatible with surrounding neighborhood;

E. Such use will not be a detriment to property values in the vicinity of the proposed development with consideration given to the location or scale of buildings, structures, parking areas, or other access ways;

F. No nuisance will be created by such use by way of emission of odors, smoke, gas, dust, noise, glare, heat, vibration, or other pollutants; or the unsightly outdoor storage of equipment, vehicles, or other materials;

G. Such use will not create a hazard to the public or adjacent property on account of potential fire, explosion, or release of toxic materials;

H. Such use will not result in the degradation of existing surface and groundwater quality standards, nor will it have adverse effects on the natural functions of wetlands on the site which would result in the loss of significant habitat or flood control protection;

I. Adequate and appropriate facilities will be provided for the intended use; and

J. All necessary state and federal permits will be obtained.

The Board of Adjustment may attach such conditions as it deems necessary to the granting of the special exception if the Board determines that such conditions are necessary to maintain the essential character of the neighborhood and/or to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Town and its residents. Such conditions may include but are not limited to the site plan review and approval from the Planning Board which includes review and comment from the Conservation Commission and Heritage Commission.

A special exception must be acted upon within two years or such special exception will be deemed to have expired and/or be lost by abandonment.

A Resolution Relative to the ELDERLY EXEMPTION POLICY

- *WHEREAS* The Londonderry Town Council, at its meeting of February 24, 1997, adopted Resolution 97-2, which enacted Chapter XII the Elderly Exemption Policy; and
- **WHEREAS** The Town Council is desirous of reviewing exemption levels and making adjustments to insure that the eligibility criteria is appropriate for current economic conditions; and,
- **WHEREAS** The Town Council may, pursuant to the provisions of RSA 72:27-a consider and act upon the question in accordance with its normal procedures for passage of resolutions, ordinances and other legislation;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Londonderry, that the provisions of *Title VI - Town Policy, Chapter XII - Elderly Exemption Policy* are hereby adopted and modified as set forth herein and shall become effective April 1st, 2019 and reviewed periodically thereafter.

Chapter XII - ELDERLY EXEMPTION POLICY

SECTION I PURPOSE

A. To adopt the provisions of RSA 72:39-A and RSA 72:39-B and establish qualifications for the optional adjusted elderly exemption.

SECTION II QUALIFICATIONS and DEFINITIONS

- A. To qualify the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least three (3) years, own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least three (3) years.
- B. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$39,600 \$40,800 if single or widowed, or if married, a combined net income (as defined in RSA 72:39-A I (b)), of not more than \$48,800 \$50,300 and own net assets not in excess of \$133,700 \$137,000, excluding the value of the person's residence up to two (2) acres.

SECTION III BENEFITS

A. The elderly exemption from property tax in the Town of Londonderry based on assessed value for qualified taxpayers shall be as follows, and shall be reviewed annually:

For a person of 65 years of age, up to 74 years	\$ 98,900
For a person of 75 years of age, up to 79 years	\$ 123,600
For a person of 80 years or older	\$ 164,800

- B. The exemption under this section shall apply only in taxable years on the residential real estate for which the exemption is claimed on April 1 in any given year.
- C. Whenever the selectmen or assessors refuse to grant an applicant an exemption to which he/she may be entitled under this section, said applicant may appeal the decision in accordance with RSA 72:34a.
- D. An exemption granted under this section shall have no effect on an applicant's eligibility for other exemptions as authorized under this chapter.
