

## LYNDEBOROUGH HERITAGE COMMISSION

July 28, 2011, J.A. Tarbell Library

Members present: Stephanie Roper, Jessie Salisbury, and Bob Rogers.

Bob opened the meeting at 7 p.m.

He said Karen Holland wants a picture of the group for the Lyndeborough Views as well as a brief description of what we do for an issue honoring volunteers.

It was decided to hold a special session on Thursday, Aug. 11, when Jen can be present, to work on several issues.

Stephanie said the Historic District Commission will hold a public hearing in September on their proposed regulations and application for Certified Legal Status. Some parts of the application apply to the Heritage Commission, including “maintaining a system for survey and inventory of historic properties,” and conducting a cultural survey.

That criteria includes the map that Commission has been working on which marks all currently known man-made historic structures including cellar holes. Bob will bring the current maps to the next meeting.

It was agreed that if all current information is transferred to a final map, it would meet the criteria.

Also to be discussed on Aug. 11:

Wording for the proposed sign by the railroad station foundation. It was suggested the sign be two-sided with a brief history of the Village on the Common side.

Helen vanHam has indicated that she has prepared a list of donations to the town from town reports.

Future projects include a historic marker for the glass factory, placing a number of eligible properties on the state register, and working toward placing all of the Village area on the register as a unit.

The clerk will notify Karen Holland of upcoming dates and will write the article about the Commission for the Views.

The meeting adjourned at 7:40.
