

LYNDEBOROUGH HERITAGE COMMISSION

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 30, TARBELL LIBRARY

The meeting opened at 7 p.m.

The minutes of Sept. 25 were accepted on a vote by Bob, seconded by Stephanie

There was a short discussion of the destruction of the memorial Christmas tree in front of the Center Hall. A new one will have granite posts to protect it.

It was noted that a snowmobile had run into a bench on the Common. Some type of temporary warning device, barrier, etc., should be placed along the railroad tracks.

CENTER SIGNS

The signs arrived and members said they were “thrilled” with the result. Stephanie will finish painting the posts and Wally will install them when he can.

The bill of \$544.99 from Ould Colony Artisans was approved on a motion by Bob, seconded by Lee. Everyone admired the calligraphy used on The “Bill of Particulars.”

REPAIR OF CENTER HALL STAGE CURTAIN

Jessie located the file from 2009 and it was decided the repair should be done and to contact Curtains Without Borders again for a new estimate of the repair work and perhaps prepare a warrant article.

COMBINING THE TWO COMMISSIONS

After discussion, and reference to suggestions from Scott Roper, it was decided the easiest way to solve the problem is to have the same people on both commissions. That would eliminate the need for a warrant article and state statute allows the Heritage Commission to assume the duties of the other commission.

Susan Patterson of New Road is interested in becoming an alternate and could serve as the required Lyndeborough Center member of the Historic District Commission.

TOWN MAPS

Several people are looking for previous maps. Lee said the town will get one from NRPC, "a good pocket map," with good visibility. Kent has a good one at the town barn which shows old culverts.

Helen vanHam says she has the map begun by the Commission some years ago which locates cellar holes. Asked what this map would be used for, members listed Planning Board, town office, Road Agent, Conservation Commission, and inclusion of information on intent-to-cut forms if there is a cellar hole on the property.
