A map of the town has been requested by several citizens. A map made in 1976 will be enlarged.

The doors on Citizens' Hall have traditionally been white and will remain so.

The deLongchamp yard and driveway question has gone to court but no decision yet. Clayton said he was familiar with a logging operation in the area in the 1950s or '60s, as well as early skidder operations. His information will be added to appropriate Old House pages.
