

LYNDEBOROUGH HERITAGE COMMISSION

THURSDAY, February 26, 2015, TARBELL LIBRARY

Present: Jessie Salisbury, Clayton Brown, Walter Holt, Stephanie Roper, Julie Zebuhr.

The meeting officially opened at 7 p.m.

Cemetery Trustee Ginny Chrisenton was unable to attend. She sent a note explaining the work to be done behind the South Cemetery. A bar way has to be created in a wall dividing the property. Access will be from the conservation land which has no wall. An informational hearing on the project will be held next month.

The minutes of Jan. 29 were approved on a motion by Stephanie, seconded by Julie.

Clayton brought a 1902 cookbook from the Lyndeborough Baptist Church for the display at the town office.

No answer has been received from the Joslin Trust concerning conservation/preservation of their property along Furnace Brook and the glass factory dam.

The discussion prompted a review of the Jerry Rand property. Mr. Rand's niece is reported as having some problems with the lease holder.

Stephanie will come up with wording for the Glass Factory historic marker for our consideration. Rick McQuade has given verbal agreement for placement on his land at the corner of Rte 31 and Glass Factory Road. Should there also be a small marker at the actual site?

Wording for a "Welcome to Lyndeborough" sign for Rte 31 will also be decided: should it just have the date of establishment or more? Wally found an original sign (being used to patch a barn roof) which reads "A Friendly Town."

A shape was chosen for the house signs. Jessie will ask the sign makers for prices.

One of the posts for the Lyndeborough Center sign was found to be slightly warped. Stephanie will get and paint a new one for installation in the spring.

It was decided that the Historic District Commission and the Heritage Commission can be effectively combined by having the same people serve on both. Scott has determined who should be on each commission as regular members so as to satisfy the membership in the HDC warrant article. Joint meetings of the two commissions would be held if needed.

Voting will not be held at the town hall because of frozen pipes.

The next meeting was set for Thursday, March 26, 7 p.m., at the library.
