

## LYNDEBOROUGH HERITAGE COMMISSION

THURSDAY, June 29, Town Hall

Present: Jessie Salisbury, Bob Rogers, Julie Zebuhr, and Stephanie Roper

7 p.m.: Stephanie opened the meeting at 7 p.m. The minutes of May 25, 2017, were approved on a motion by Bob, seconded by Stephanie. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$2,259.26 on May 31. There were no new intent-to-cut forms.

### JUNE 3 HISTORICAL SOCIETY PROGRAM

Only three people attended and two chairs were sold. David Schmidt and Betty Reindeau left several glass and china Lyndeborough souvenirs which are now on display at the library.

### MONUMENTS COMMITTEE

Stephanie said she had weed-whacked the edges and has ordered a "cube" of 470 bricks, an anonymous donation. Unmarked bricks will be placed in the new walkway to and/or around the flagpole and will be replaced by memorials as ordered.

The plaques for the center stone have been ordered from Medlyn's, bronze, 16 by 14 inches. Mr. Medlyn will provide a mock-up for viewing. A proper dedication ceremony will be held this summer.

It was agreed this committee should be included in our agenda because their activities are not recorded any place else.

### GLASS FACTORY SIGN

The new larger sign has been ordered.

Stephanie has trimmed around it and said the land owner has "neatened up" the area adjacent to it. The town will provide loam this summer or fall so the bank around and below the sign can be graded and seeded.

### CLARK POTTERY SIGN

Discussion postponed until the Glass Factory sign is completed. Perhaps Devir's across the road could be asked about flowers.

### CITIZENS' HALL DISPLAY CASES

The four cases were put in place on June 19 by builder Chris Schoen and Scott Roper and it was agreed they are "beautiful and fit the space." A thank you note will be sent. When the Historical Society artifacts have been inventoried, appropriate items will be chosen for display.

### LIBRARY STORAGE ROOM

Wally has almost completed the area with shelves and most items moved there. Only a few larger items remain in the former space. The room is to be completed with ventilation, a lockable door and a light. Jessie and Stephanie will do the inventory and cataloguing. Several "blotter books" were found.

### COMMUNITY DAY ON AUG. 19

No decisions were made. Jessie will not be present.

### OTHER BUSINESS

The chain around the Woodward Monument has been found detached again, the front chain pulled out of the post broken by the snow plow.

At this point, 7:50 p.m., Town Administrator Russ Boland came in – he said had been passing by – and was informed of the broken chain and the need for a thank you note to Chris Schoen. He will tend to both items.
