### SHOW AND TELL

A gift was received from Tom Schultz of Wilton: a framed Civil War certificate of commendation received by Jason Holt in 1867. Mark will take it to Citizens' Hall where it will be added to the other pictures.

Received from the New Boston Historical Society, a copy of an oration given at the funeral of Rev. Benjamin Clark. He was the son of Peter Clark, born in 1808 and a potter until he felt called to the ministry. He graduated from Miami University in Ohio and returned to Lyndeborough in 1837. The booklet was accepted by the Historical Society.

Bob had a photograph of a wildflower he wanted identified. According to Peterson's "A Field Guide to Wildflowers," it is a round-leaf pyrola.

### FOURTH GRADE HISTORY TOUR

The tour on June 6, went well except for an ill student who was cared for by teachers. It was agreed the tours should continue. Children need more involvement in the town and its history.

# CLARK POTTERY SIGN UPDATE

It was noted that at some time in the past, capstones from the wall along Furnace Hill Road had been stolen, as well as one from Johnson's Corner. Bob recalled that the Whittemore Cemetery was badly vandalized in the past. It was agreed such vandalism is "sick" but not much can be done to prevent it.
