- 1. Discussion of board members' end of terms. Gutterman says term as chair ends December, 2013. Weiss' term also ending, but can be re-elected. Discussion of Robin Campbell's desire to be on council.
- 2. Discussion of Poetry Live! Need to contact LMC-TV. Poetry magazines from schools will be requested to display at event. Planning for event is well along. Discussion of setting up a blog for VOMAC Weiss and De Santis to consult. Looking ahead Don suggests a poetry evening for adults, Stringer suggests a poetry slam. Discussion of poetry reading at Café Mozart and café vs. theater environment.
- 3. Stringer gave update on Word of Mouth. Post production is done, titles and transitions, jazz theme song. Premiere will be middle to end of March.
